Membership cards will be available at the January meeting.


Meeting was adjourned and members enjoyed the Christmas party.

- Happy New Year! May your new year be one of new beginnings, happiness, good health, safety and wonderful times spent quilting "Bits and Pieces" of your life.
- With the holidays behind us and the hustle and bustle
 of so much activity, hopefully everyone is thinking
 about that next quilting project or starting something
 new. With all the creative ideas floating around, sometimes it is difficult to know where to begin. Your Guild
 Library is a good place to find resource information to
 help begin or finish that project.
- I am delighted to tell you about some new additions to our Guild Library that just might spark some interest and creativity. We have added a new iquilt DVD "Color Theory for Quilters" by Katie Pasquini Masopust. I know some of you were born with the gift of using color in marvelous ways in your quilts but, if you are like me, you struggle with picking the right fabric to make that project pop. This is a DVD which covers the same information in the on-line class. Learn to use color more freely, shop smarter and utilize your stash more effectively as Katie teaches you to see color in your projects and build confidence about your choices.
- Another delightful addition is a gift to our library. The book "Every Quilt Has a Story" by Nancy E. Mink. This is meant as a gift book with wonderful inspiration and colorful watercolors. This book reminds us that, "locked inside the stitches of every quilt are bits and pieces of life. Celebrations and adventure, hopes and dreams, even hardships and sorrows are sewn between layers."
