MEETING MINUTES

27 January 2015

President Anne Perry called the meeting to order at 7PM.

Minutes of the November meeting were approved as read.

Linda Waugh, Vice President, shared the forecast of programs for this year. A garage sale of quilt related items will be held at the May meeting.

Jean Goldsberry explained the program for the evening. Eight members brought in the first quilt they ever made and their most recent quilt. We were challenged to match each member's first and most recent quilt. To those of you who shared your quilts, congratulations on the phenomenal growth displayed in your quilting skills.

Quilter's Minute was presented by Anne Perry.

Treasurer Jean Weber presented the proposed budget for 2015. A vote was taken by the membership to approve the 2015 budget in its entirety.

Nancy Peters, quilt show chair, discussed the Fanfare of Quilts Show 2016. There are many opportunities for us to volunteer. There are still several opportunities to share your talents to head up a committee. Please call or email Nancy to discuss these opportunities.

Debbie Ernst, a committee member of the 2015 guild challenge, announced this year's theme and title, "What's your number?" She explained that members were to chose an even number to be matched to a page from the "National Geographic" magazine. Both sides of that page may be used as an inspiration for your challenge piece. Rules for the challenge will be given out to people who sign up. Quilts will be displayed at the September meeting for judging. The top three quilts will receive prizes. Sign-up will be available at our meetings.

Cover our Kids Chair, Chris Williams, gave a brief overview of the COK mission. She listed the organizations that received quilts this past year. The first COK Sew Day was

held on January 20th and 12 members participated. The next COK Sew day will be held on Saturday, February 28, at the church. Chris let us know about some changes in due dates for baggy blocks and kits. Baggy blocks need to be returned the month following sign-out whether they are finished or not. Kits need to be returned in two months after sign-out. Again, they need to be turned in whether they are completed or not. A new "ribbon" task has been added to the program. This new "white" ribbon will represent small bags of scraps—Scrap Baggies, that will need to be pressed and trimmed into usable shapes—and be returned at the following meeting.

Judy Humphrey reported on the Honor Flight quilt project. To date, enough quilts have been turned in to be given for the March flight. We still need additional quilts for the April flight. Contact Judy if you need additional information.

Darla Gibson explained our UFO activity. Forms will be available to list those unfinished projects that have been piled away in your sewing room. The goal is to finish as many as you can. Prizes are awarded at the end of the year to those who have finished the most projects.

Darla also announced that a One Day Retreat will be held April 11th at the West County Fire Station. There is a \$10 dollar charge for the day that includes lunch.

New Business

The next Workshop by Members will be presented by Candy Grisham and Judy Humphrey. They will guide us through creating a wool appliqué needle book.

Anne Perry announced that a volunteer was needed to be the Set up Coordinator. Please contact Anne if you would like to volunteer or have any questions.

Anne also asked for input about continuing the BOM. If you are interested in heading up a BOM for the guild please contact her.

Please mark your calendar! Our July meeting date has been changed to **July 21**. The church will be holding Vacation Bible School

during the last week of July and the meeting space will not be available. Our July meeting will be held **Tuesday**, **July 21**st.

A 10 minute break was taken.

During that break members looked at the "first quilt and the most recent quilt" challenge. Each wrote down their matches. After the break the makers of the quilts were revealed. Prizes were given to those members who had the most matches.

Laura Khoury reported there were 82 members present. Attendance prizes were given out.

Susan Calzone, Retreat Chair, spoke about the next retreat June 3rd through June 7th at Todd Hall. A sign-up sheet is available or you can call Susan. Meals can be purchased from Todd Hall or you can bring your own food.

Anne requested that small group committee chairs, who have a report to submit, contact her prior to the meeting so it may be placed on the agenda.

Several of the small group Chairs gave a brief overview of their groups.

Many members participated in Show and Tell.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:57 PM.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

COK and More: Chris Williams

- Cover Our Kids & More is the service project of Bits 'n' Pieces Quilt Guild. We make and donate quilts to various agencies throughout the St. Louis metropolitan area. For those of you who are new, this is truly a group effort of the entire guild. Some members piece baggy blocks, some sew quilt tops, some quilt the quilts, others sew on bindings all depending on the time and abilities they have to share. I hope we can continue in this generous fashion in 2015 and encourage any new members to get involved in this very worthwhile project.
- We started the year out with a great fun Sew Day on January 20th here at Salem Methodist Church. There were 12 members who joined us for a fun, productive day of sewing and cutting. The next Sew Day is Saturday February 28th. A flyer will be sent out shortly with more information.
- Something new we are trying this year is to have a cutting station at the sew day. If you want to come join the fellowship but don't want to or can't bring your sewing machine and equipment, I will have scraps or kits to be cut. No need to bring anything except a rotary cutter.
- I hope you will join us at the next sew day here at the Church.
 NEW MEMBERS ARE ALWAYS WELCOME!

Baggy Blocks:

- <u>Darla Gibson</u> volunteered to be the first Baggy Block Coordinator and she took the 9 patch blocks turned in at the January meeting. Darla will be organizing the blocks into kits which will be available soon at upcoming meetings.
- <u>Laurie Schrader</u> is our Baggy Block Coordinator for <u>January's</u> friendship star block and will be collecting the blocks at the February Bits meeting. All of the blocks were signed out and we are looking forward to seeing them completed at the February 24th meeting. If you cannot complete a block, please return it at the meeting anyway.
- <u>Lisa Marsden</u> will be the coordinator for the <u>February</u> baggy blocks and has already started on that project.
- <u>Debbie Briscoe</u> will be the coordinator for the <u>March</u> baggy blocks.
- "The Company" mini group has volunteered to coordinate the April baggy blocks. Thanks to those who volunteered to be coordinators.
- At the January meeting, I announced a change in the return dates for the kits, asking that the kits be returned within 2 months. I would like to clarify that request as follows:
 - 1. Kits that are taken home to be pieced, please return 2 months after the meeting.
 - 2. Kits that are taken home to be quilted, please return 2 months after the meeting.
 - 3. Kits that are taken home to be quilted <u>and</u> pieced, please return no later than 3 months after the meeting.
- If you find you are not going to be able to meet these guidelines, please contact Chris Williams or return the quilt to COK so that we can keep the process moving.
- Also, there are several kits still outstanding from 2014. If you
 have a kit, finished or unfinished, please return it at the February
 28th meeting...again, no questions asked.
- We have a growing stash of scraps languishing in storage so it is

time to get those into the talented hands of our members. Thus the creation of yet another ribbon to the already colorful COK Color Chart:

• NEW RIBBON: Scrap Bags—WHITE Ribbon:

- Similar to baggy blocks, each month there will be small bags of scraps tied with a WHITE Ribbon. The scraps will need to be pressed and cut into more useable sizes to be used for blocks and kits.
- Like baggy blocks, there will be instructions in each packet for cutting sizes and will need to be signed out and returned by the next meeting. Each Scrap Bag should take only about an hour or so to complete.
- As a final note, I have taken pictures of all of the COK quilts that
 were turned in during 2014. If there is a quilt you would like to see
 again, please see me at the meeting. I have all of the pictures on
 my IPad and would be happy to forward a copy to you.

QUILTER'S QUEST QUORNER

Question: What brand/model of iron do you use and why?

For years I used my mother's Sunbeam steam iron, probably bought in the 1950's. And then I knocked it on the concrete floor and it died. I then bought a Rowenta, Surfline, titan plus, DE 46.1, made in Germany and bought it in the early 90's. Still use the steam iron. I fell for a Rowenta with all the bells and whistles, 120 holes in the plate, and lights that indicated it was ready to use, but it lasted only 3 months, factory repaired and lasted another 6 weeks. I threw it away. The other iron I use is a GE, model 17F3 1/4. I bought it at a garage sale for a \$1 and had a new cord put on it. It's great for applying fusibles. Barb Warner

I got tired of buying expensive irons that pooped out, so I went on Amazon and bought the Panasonic NI-E200T. The iron cost less than \$25 and is great. Rosemary Hopkins

I use an off-the-shelf (cheap) iron from Target or Wal Mart that feels good in my hands and has a good point. All the expensive ones I've had (read Rowenta) have leaked or died and I can keep a \$20 iron for years. I just wish they didn't auto shut off. I like irons to be heavy and with steam. I now have a Black and Decker that I love. Candy Grisham

I recently purchased the Rowenta Steam Station and love it. Very smooth and gets wrinkles out on the first try. Hope will last for years. Cheryl Cobert

I don't have a favorite, but I must have one with an automatic shut-off feature. Wendy Richards

I too, love Rowenta irons. I have 3.....but my very favorite is my Rowenta travel iron. I have a TV table with the appropriate ironing piece on it by my sewing table, with my little Rowenta. It's just so handy for all the little pieces that you use for quilting. The regular size Rowenta is on my ironing board for larger pieces and backing and sometimes my own personal things. I just purchased a new Rowenta for the ironing board too. I just switch back and forth and I really like them both. Carol Wynn

I learned very quickly that I could drop and break an expensive iron just as quickly as I could a cheaper iron. I also learned that Rowenta did not last nearly as long for me as I would have hoped. Right now I have several irons, none top of the line. The features are what matter to me. I look for light weight to take to sew days. I look for ones that do not automatically shut off for all day sewing sessions at home. I like a large, easy-to-stay-clean sole plate for pressing new yardage. I even have an iron I bought from The Vermont Country Store catalog that has no steam vents for fusing when steam is not needed. I like my Panasonic probably the best. Fran Collins
