

Guild Meeting February 28, 2017



Jan Ochterbeck has been interested in fabric and sewing all her life, and like many quilters today, she started making doll clothes as a very young child. From age 8, her ambition was to become a fashion designer. She attended Stephens College in Columbia Missouri, where she graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Fashion Design.

Jan worked professionally in apparel, textiles, and footwear product development for over 35 years. Her jobs have included pattern making, designing apparel, color and trend research, technical color approval, and color and material library management.

A quilter since the early 1990's, Jan is mostly self-taught, drawing on her sewing and professional experience to figure out patterns and piecing. Now retired, Jan is focusing on her quilting as a new chapter in her life. In 2015, her book *Cut and Shuffle Quilts* was published by AQS. She designs patterns, blogs at TheColorfulFabriholic.blogspot.com, lectures, and teaches.

At tonight's "Cut and Shuffle Quilts Trunk Show", Jan will present a selection of the quilts she has made over the years, featuring those that led to the development of her book *Cut and Shuffle Quilts*, as well as subsequent designs and stand-alone patterns. Jan tells the story of how *Cut and Shuffle Quilts* came to be, and shares her surprisingly simple "Block Mama" method. Copies of *Cut and Shuffle Quilts* are available for purchase, as are stand-alone patterns.

- The February meeting gave us a sneak peak at the 2017 raffle quilt for the Thimble and Threads Quilt Show. Like me, it also probably reminded you of that list of projects you want to complete for our Bits & Pieces 2018 Quilt Show. - If you are considering quilting some of those projects yourself, I would like to tell you about a new addition to our Guild Library that you might find of interest. We have added another new iquilt DVD "Creative Quilting Design" by Joanie Zeier Poole. We have so many talented quilters in our guild but I also know there are lots of us just beginning to try some quilting on our own and quilters are always looking for new ways to do things and new ideas. This is a DVD which covers the same information in the AQS on-line class. Printable class files are also included. Joanie uses an easy paper template system. The DVD teaches how to :
 - Confidently approach borders
 - Minimize and enlarge quilting motifs to fit your quilt measurements
 - Divide the spaces on your quilt top for more beautiful quilting
 - Find quilting inspiration from stencils, patterns or 3-D objects
 - Transfer quilt patterns onto your quilt tops with ease
- Let Joanie show you how to make original quilting designs that you never imagined were possible. I hope you enjoy this class DVD and that you are inspired to get those projects quilted and, don't forget the quilt label which should include information that can be enjoyed for generations to come.
- Your Guild Library is a wonderful resource of books as well as DVDs, and fictional quilt related novels. Whatever your quilting interest, you are encouraged to check out this wonderful resource.
- Your Guild Library is located at the back of the meeting room in a cabinet in the side classroom. Stop by the table just outside this room to check out or return library items or if you need assistance in locating an item.
