Art and Wanda met at a square dance, have been dancing ever since, and make many of their dance costumes. Wanda has taught quilting classes in piecing and appliqué. Together they lecture on topics such as color, fabric choices, hanky quilts, and how guys and gals can both quilt while living in the same house. They each have their own style of quilting and have shared the sewing room over their 21 years of blissful married life.

Both Art and Wanda are juried quilt artists and Wanda won awards at the 2013 Quintessential Quilt Show. They have held several offices in Thimble and Thread Quilt Guild as well as local dance organizations.

Wanda has 3 cats and Art has a dog, a combination that makes for a lively household. They reside in an 1859 farm house in Kirkwood, MO.



MEETING MINUTES



25 March 2014

Bits and Pieces Quilt Guild Meeting, February 25, 2014

President Judy Humphrey called the February 25, 2014 meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

Vice President Linda Waugh introduced Quilter's Minute speaker Kathy Young. She then introduced Sandy Sagan. Sandy presented her "Color, Your Best Friend or Your Worst Enemy" program.

Judy Humphrey asked for corrections and additions to the minutes of the January meeting. Merrily Woodford noted that her last name was misspelled. The Secretary apologized and will correct the January minutes. The minutes were approved with correction.

Judy called for committee reports.

Quilt Show Committee - Nancy Sinise, chairman, reminded members the quilt show is March 15 and 16. There are 328 quilts in the judged show and many more in special exhibitions. Forty vendors will be at the show.

Nancy Peters explained how the quilt show drop off works. The drop off person, who will be collecting your quilts, will contact you to set up a time to deliver your quilts for the show. Please remember: your quilt must have a label, sleeve, and no pet hair. Your quilts must be in a pillow case using masking tape as a label with name, address, and phone number. Your drop off person will provide you with each quilt's number that refers to the location where it hangs in the show.

Nancy Sinise announced that volunteers are still needed for the quilt show. You can still sign up on our website or contact Chris Williams. If you have signed up for setup/take down please bring a two or three step ladder. Carts, wagons, and dollies are also needed to move quilts for hanging and take down. Please post show flyers about town. Consider your church, a library, the community board at your grocery store, the places to post are unlimited.

Nancy Sinise thanked Mary Lou Melkowski and Roxann Jasper for making more ribbons for added categories in the show. There will be 18 categories in this year's show.

The Quilt show set up will begin on Friday, March 14. If you are a drop off person please deliver quilts between 12 and 12:30. Set-up for the show will begin at 12:30. Show day volunteers should arrive one half hour before their shifts. Saturday morning volunteers should arrive by 9:30 am, and Sunday morning volunteers should arrive by 10:30 AM. Members are asked to park on the upper lot at Queeny Park.

Advertising the show is very important. Please help by using social media as an additional source to spread the word. Consider posting the flyer (found on the Bits website, members section) on your Facebook page. Posting your status updates of your show quilts on Facebook is another idea to use.

Cover Our Kids - Chris Williams read a thank you note from Alberta Lee for the generous donation of quilts to Mercy Children's hospital and commented about being asked to be a part of the group who provided information for the West Magazine article. Chris said the first Sew Day was very successful. It was held at Cheryl Cobert's company facility. Thank you Cheryl. The next Sew Day is March 29 at St. John's Lutheran Church on Manchester Road.

To help with the making of the COK quilts, Chris said the "I Can" sign-up sheets are ready for you. There are four "I Can" tasks to volunteer to do: "I Can" make a baggy block, "I Can make a quilt top, "I Can" bind a quilt, "I Can" quilt a quilt.

Judy announced that we need several members to step forward to fill three chairman vacancies. Those chairmanships are: Meeting set-up, retreat, and Raffle Quilt 2016. She congratulated and thanked this year's Raffle Quilt committee for their hard work and success.

Raffle Quilt - Debbie Ernst announced that 4,782 tickets have been sold to date for this year's raffle guilt.

National Speakers - Wendy Richards announced Susan Cleveland will be presenting her workshops May 27, 28, and 29. Her schedule will be: Bits meeting on the evening of May 27, May 28 Marvelous Miters 1-4pm, Precision and Panache 6-9 pm, and May 29 Piping Hot Bindings 9-4. All workshops will be held at Trinity Lutheran Church on Clayton Road at 141. Wendy is accepting signups for the workshops.

Membership - Lisa Marsden announced that eighty eight people were in attendance. Five guests were introduced. Attendance prizes were provided by Old Country Store of Landcaster, PA, and Jackman's Fabrics. Membership dues of \$25 are due. If you have a quilt in the show please make sure your membership is up to date.

Newsletter - Cindy Holten announced the program for the quilt show has been completed. She said the CD's of the 2012 quilt show are now available for \$10. Please contact Cindy for a CD.

UFO - Mary Lou Melkowski has extended the submission of this year's UFO list until the March meeting.

Miscellaneous Comments - Wendy said that CraftOptics, a show vendor, is donating one complete set of CraftOptics Telescopes that will include readers or prescription lenses valued at \$474. They will be one of the items in the raffle.

Show and Tell followed the meeting. Congratulations and thanks to Southern Stitchers for donating twenty quilts to COK.

Judy adjourned the meeting at 8:40.

COK and More: Chris Williams

- Thanks to the snow/weather delays, the first Sew Day of the year was held on February 15. Cheryl Cobert generously opened her meeting room to us for the day and the room worked extremely well. Cheryl has agreed to host us again, so we may well take advantage of her hospitality.
- The next Sew Day is Saturday, March 29. We are returning to St. John's Lutheran Church on that day. COK has been off to a rather slow start this year, but Southern Stitchers took advantage of severe cabin fever and gave us many quilts.
- At the February meeting I started a new "I CAN" campaign. At the meeting I posted "I CAN" sign up sheets, giving you a chance to actually tell me what you can do to help. The sign up sheets were for:
 - I CAN CUT A QUILT TOP
 - I CAN CUT BAGGIE BLOCKS
 - I CAN QUILT A TOP
 - I CAN BIND A QUILT TOP
- If you sign up, I will contact you to learn what you are willing and/or able to do.
- This is not a lifelong commitment. If you put your name down and find later that you are unable to help, there will be no repercussions. I am asking you to put your name down where you would like to help. I will then call you and we can work out the particulars – For example
 - I can only pick things up at meeting
 - I can only help on Tuesdays
 - I need someone to deliver stuff to me
 - I can only help during the day
 - I can give you 1 night per month for a couple of hours
 - I can quilt, but only small quilts.
 - I would be happy to put on a binding
 - I could host an additional cut night or day sometime.
 - I could come to your house to help with whatever.
- Everyone has a life and limitations and "best times". I will be happy to work with you, if you will help me.
- Note that COK will supply you with fabric required so this will not be coming from your own stash or pocketbook.
- So, please look at the "I CAN" sheets at the next meeting and put your name down. I will call you and we will work out an "I CAN" schedule that best fits you.
- If you want to think about it, put your name down anyway. I promise, there will be no pressure.
