to Your Quilt Blocks**


**Presented by Toby Lischko**

**T**oby has been quilting since 1985 and teaching quilting workshops since 1995. She considers herself a traditional quilter who loves working with traditional quilt blocks, but likes to add her own special flair. She has won many national awards for her quilts including a blue ribbon for her “Celestial Crowns” quilt at the AQS show in Paducah, Kentucky and the MQX show in 2005.

She has her own line of patterns and templates under the name of Gateway Quilts & Stuff, Inc. and two books: St. Louis Stars and her newest book, Kaleidostars. She also does commissioned work for many of the major fabric companies and has been published in most of the national quilt magazines since 1998. In her classes, Toby enjoys instilling the feeling that quilting should be fun, not difficult, and loves hearing students say, “I didn’t think I could do that!”

This award-winning designer, author, and quilter will have a trunk show at the March meeting followed by a workshop on March 29. Her workshop will be on her gorgeous 4-block “Parfait” block, based on her “Kaleidostar” book. This is one workshop you don’t want to miss, so be sure to sign up now. ### February 28, 2017

Cover Our Kids chair, Louis Morris, asked for volunteers to take charity quilts to Youth In Need and Crisis Nursery. She also asked members donating quilts to put guild-provided labels on the quilts. No sew days have been scheduled as of yet. There are sign-up sheets at the COK table for baggy block coordinators.

Challenge Quilt chair, Cindy Holten, announced the 2017 challenge theme "Get Your MOJO - Show Our Logo!" The rules will be on the website along with a color chart. All challenge quilts have to be finished and signed up to be in the challenge and quilt show registrations must be completed. Reveal will be at the October 24 quilt meeting.

Peggy Anderson announced that members can still sign up for UFO program next month.

Library chair, Kay Merz, announced the purchase of an "I Quilt" DVD.

Retreats chair, Susan Calzone, announced that she sent an email to the membership announcing a new weekend retreat opportunity for members that cannot attend during the week.

Quilt Show 2018 coordinator, Joyce Zepp, announced that the first quilt show planning meeting was held tonight. Volunteers are still needed to fill chairperson positions.

After a ten-minute break, Membership Chair Candy Grisham announced that 118 members were in attendance. She awarded six attendance prizes.

Nancy Peters thanked the members that attended the Scraps meeting at Salem. She invited all members to attend Scraps the second Monday of the month at 9:30am.

### **COK and More: Louise Morris**

- Tuesday night brought in 19 donated quilts, two quilt tops and the threat of dangerous weather. While we dodged a bullet, our neighbors to the south in Perryville were not so fortunate.
- On Wednesday morning Sue Meyer called and wondered if we had quilts to spare to send to displaced families with small children. And we did! Within hours, 20+ quilts were on their way. It was a reminder to always keep some quilts in reserve because you never know.
- We also picked up a new organization thanks to the suggestion of Debbie Ernst and it is Circle of Concern, the recipient of all the canned goods you bring to the meeting over the holidays. Their needs, like so many others, go beyond feeding hungry families.
- While I don't want to spread ourselves too thin by adding more organizations, we have had enough quilts this year to make two donation runs to most of our recipients.
- At the meeting I made a plea to please sew the labels onto your donated quilts before turning them in but I forgot to mention that I am happy to mail out labels if you have 4 or more quilts ready to turn in. Also, please use the washed labels and place them on the quilts not on the plastic bags.
- While preparing for the meeting I realized I am quickly using up the last of the batting I purchased from the Innova dealer last year. Not to worry, they will be at the Thimble and Thread quilt show at Queeny Park on the 18th and 19th of March. I hope you will come out to support that guild and maybe buy a bolt of batting, if needed. The price has gone up to \$110 + tax per bolt for 30 yards by 96 inches of 80/20, but still a bargain! I am having them hold some for me but if you need some, come early as they are only bringing 15 or so to sell.
- Look for a new kind of baggie block next month that I hope will be fun and different! We have spaces for Baggie Block Chairs still available. I have not gotten sew days set up yet, sorry, but if I don't have one in March, I will try for two in April. See you in March and thanks so much for your continued support of Cover our Kids!

**THANK YOU:** I want to send a big thank you to Louise Morris and the Cover Our Kids quilters. I was able to take over 20 quilts to the Perryville tornado victims.
