Invisible Women and Silent Quilts by Mindy Smith



Mindy Smith (http://bymindysmith.com/home.html) is a textile/mixed media artist in Columbia, Missouri. She teaches quilting art classes and lectures on the topics—Documenting your Quilts and Discovering the Story in the Quilt. Mindy started quilting 30 years ago and has made many commissioned quilts, as well as, several that were donated to charitable auctions. Her fiber art has been displayed at the University of Missouri.

She says she is very blessed with her life of quilting—she makes quilts for charities, her art quilts have been displayed, she is active in her guild, and

teaches art quilting, free motion quilting, and thread painting, plus she curates a quilt showing for the Daniel Boone Regional Library in Columbia.

But, with all that richness in her life, it always is still heartbreaking to Mindy when she sees quilts in shops with no label...no identification of who the quilter was and why she made that quilt. The quilt is a document of that woman's life, but she is invisible to me.

Mindy became fascinated with that "invisible woman" and longed for the story of each of those "silent quilts" so she began to develop processes that tell that story—a communication with the world—within the quilts she makes. That is the fundamentals of her presentation. We all have life experiences and so do our quilts and Mindy will share unique methods of being the voice of your quilt by creatively documenting the special stories of each quilt. You won't even need any new tools.
