


Guild Program for August 26, 2014


It will be a fun, fascinating, and informative Round Robin Program!

- DAYTIME SEW DAY—SEP 16 at the Salem United Methodist Church, 9 am-4 pm. The usual supplies (irons, cutting boards, rulers, design wall) will be supplied as well as a CHOCOLATE treat. However, COK kits will not be supplied unless you specifically request one. Please bring your own COK sewing projects (like those challenge quilts or UFOs or even Christmas gifts...it's never too early).
- You may have noticed the colored ribbons on each COK kit bag. It is a color coding tool to help members choose which task they would like to do: Piece, Quilt, Bind, etc.
 - <u>GREEN</u> A complete kit ready to piece (includes backing, batting and binding).
 - <u>**RED**</u> A partial kit. This may include some blocks that need to be pieced and may not include batting and backing.
 - <u>YELLOW</u> A kit in process kit needs additional pieces cut and added to kit.
 - <u>BLUE</u> Ready to quilt.
 - **ORANGE** Needs binding and washing and label.
 - **PURPLE** Ready to be quilted small quilt for domestic machine. This color was recently added. These small quilts offer a great opportunity to practice machine quilting and improve your skills.
- Please know that if you cannot or do not wish to finish a quilt for any reason, please return it to me. For instance, if don't want to bind the quilt that you pieced, just return it and we will find someone who enjoys binding quilts. You do NOT have to complete a quilt kit...just do what you can and return it.
- Thank you all for your generosity. You not only contribute this great guild program, but also warm and comfort someone in need of a "quilt hug".
