Chris Williams will be passing on the Chairmanship of Cover Our Kids at the end of the year. This is such an important undertaking for our guild because it serves so many children and elderly. Search your heart...is there room for one more good deed?

COK and More: Chris Williams

- To repeat my August report and my announcement at the August meeting, I will be ending my term as Chair of Cover Our Kids at the end of this year. It is time for someone to take over this service project for the guild. If you are interested or would just like to talk about what is involved, please give me a call and I will be happy to talk to you and answer your questions. Something to consider might be sharing this job with another member as Co-Chairs of COK. Two people sharing the job would make it so much more manageable.
- Although this is a big job, it is also a great privilege to be such a very important part of our guild's service to our community. I hope you will seriously consider this opportunity.
- Also, so that the first part of the year is not so taxing for the new Chair, I will plan to take care of setting up the COK booth at the 2016 Bits quilt show, should this be your desire. Although you will need to man the booth, which will be an easy volunteer job, I will provide all the quilts for display and a slide show of the past two years.
- Our members were busy during August and turned in 29 quilts - 13 completed COK kits (which included 6 donated quilt tops in various stages of completion that were assigned kit numbers) and16 donation quilts! To date, we have received 122 quilts. My closet is filling up and I will be making distributions shortly. I know that you are all busy finishing off your challenge quilts and your quilts for the 2016 quilt show, but I am hoping you will find time to add a COK quilt to your schedule.
- A good portion of our sew day/work day in July was given to sorting through all the fabric/blocks/quilts in process that we were gifted by Peggy Knight's family. I don't think any of us had any idea how prolific a quilter Peggy was. Over the next few months, you may find a kit with the usual number and name and a notation ("Peggy") on the label. These are projects yielded from the Peggy Knight donations. I am trying to track some of these projects to keep Peggy's family apprised of the quilts donated in Peggy's name.
- At this point, I have not scheduled a Sew Day for September, but I will contact the Church to see if Saturday, September 26th is available and will send out a notice shortly if that date will work.
