MEETING MINUTES

President Anne Perry called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm.

Anne announced that the newsletter deadline is Friday, August 26, 2016.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes. Passed unanimously.

The Treasurer's report will be presented at the September meeting for approval.

Vice President, Chris Williams introduced Susan Marth of Suzn Quilts. She presented a trunk show and lecture "Finding Time to Sew".

Anne Perry announced that Joyce Zepp will chair the 2018 Quilt Show.

Candy Grisham announced that the dyeing workshop scheduled in September is almost full. There are a few spots left. Honor Flight kits are available.

Holiday Block exchange chairperson Trisha Hill announced that no blocks will be accepted after the November meeting. Fabric for the blocks is available.

Marsha Bray announced that three DVDs of the last quilt show are available for \$10.00 apiece.

After the break, the meeting resumed.

Anne announced that a chairperson is still needed for the December Holiday Party.

Anne discussed the development of Second Hand Rose for the sale of modestly priced used quilting items. This will be presented at the September meeting. Retreat chairperson, Susan Calzone announced a change in the retreat packages available. There will be a four-day retreat with an optional front-end day. Call or email Susan to reserve a spot.

Block of the Month chairperson, Mary Lou Melkowski showed the current month block and suggested coloring in the pattern for ease of piecing.

Membership chairperson, Candy Grisham announced attendance of 105 with five new members and five guests. Five attendance prizes were awarded.

Cover Our Kids chairperson, Louise Morris asked that all donations include information forms. Scheduled sew days are Tuesday, September 6, and Saturday, October 22, 2016. There are 210 quilts on the books, 44 quilts are now kitted and 120 quilts will be dropped off next week. There are COK labels available at the back of the room.

Debbie Ernst announced that the A-Team mini group will hold an organizational meeting on September 14, 2016 at 9:30 am at her home. This mini-group welcomes all skill levels. If anyone has questions they should call Debbie.

It's a wonderful problem to have, though, thanks to all the ways members have contributed to our service project. You will all be recognized in November for all your efforts, with a slide show, a presentation of this year's COK Challenge quilts, a couple of speakers to help remind us of why we love doing this, and prizes for all our participants!
- I also want to thank all of our Baggie block coordinators for all of their help this year. That is no small task and adds significantly to the number of quilts we are able to donate to our charities. Please help them out by returning all Baggie blocks. We will not have any more blocks to sign out until 2017. The same goes for all the volunteers that give time, talent and donations beyond anyone's expectations ! (We're talking platinum status!) I will have some unbelievable statistics to wow you all.
- There are only two more sew days scheduled for this year: Tuesday, Sept. 6, and Saturday, Oct. 22, so come join us if you have the time.
- At the August meeting I received 10 quilts from kits, 17 donated quilts, 2 quilt tops from a sew day and 9 quilts were signed out in various stages of completion. We are over 260 quilts at this point, not all completed yet, of course, but our charities are well covered for the year! Keep working on your Challenge quilts and I will see you in September.

 - The prices vary depending on attendance but are very close to those listed below:
 - double occupancy, *with meals \$238
 - double occupancy, no meal \$148
 - single occupancy, *with meals \$304
 - single occupancy, no meals \$214
 - Tuesday arrival, double, no meals + \$48
 - Tuesday arrival, single, no meals + \$70
 - * Meals are only available if there are at least ten retreaters purchasing them.
- Space is limited so clear your calendar and sign up early as we have been filling to capacity. If you are unsure, or the retreat is full, I can put you on a wait list and contact you closer to the retreat or in the event of


