MEETING MINUTES

September 26, 2017

President Peggy Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of August 22, 2017. The motion passed unanimously.

President Anderson announced that the newsletter deadline is September 29, 2017 at 5pm. She also asked for volunteers to staff the nominating committee to fill the positions for Vice-President and Secretary for the coming year.

Vice President Chris Williams showed the membership the new quilt hanger purchased by the guild.

Chris Williams introduced the evening speaker Shelly Pagliai of Prairie Moon Quilts who presented the evening's program "The Life of Hazel Ilene".

Challenge Quilt chair, Cindy Holten announced that quilts for the "Get Your Mojo, Show our Logo" challenge are due next month. The quilts will be revealed at the October 24, 2017 meeting. Bring the challenge quilts to the church no later than 5:00pm so there is ample time to hang and organize the quilts.

Quilt Show chair Joyce Zepp asked members to complete one registration per quilt. Registrations will be collected starting next month.

Holiday Block chair Mona Howard thanked the membership for all the cards and letters. Over thirty blocks have been turned in and more fabric is available. The blocks turned in at tonight's meeting will have two chances to win blocks in December.

After a fifteen minute break, Sue Meyer showed the logo bags available for purchase. She announced that the game Quilto will be played at the December Holiday Party. Members will need to bring buttons, pennies or something else to use as markers. She also asked members to bring snacks such as cookies, cookie bars, fruit or dip. Members are asked to bring food for the church food bank and diapers and wipes for an additional donation.

She asked that members dress in festive clothing. Volunteers are needed for set up.

Cover Our Kids chair Louise Morris announced that 230 quilts are on the books. She has tops that need to be quilted. She thanked everyone that attended the sew day and asked for volunteers to staff this committee next year as she is stepping down. She estimates that at least three people are needed. She still has about 150 quilts that need to be distributed.

Chris Williams announced that the next Fun Sew Day is scheduled October 6, 2017 at the West County Fire Department on Henry Road. A sign-up sheet is being distributed at tonight's meeting.

Phyllis Bednarek announced that approximately forty raffle quilt envelopes have not been picked up. 2300 tickets have been sold. Dorothy White was drawn as the quarterly prize winner. Next drawing will be at the December meeting.

Candy Grisham, Membership chair, announced 110 people in attendance, three new members and five guests. Three attendance prizes were awarded. She asked for volunteers to chair the committee in the coming year.

There will be no Charity Sharity in November or December.

Carol Spindler was the winner of the Block of the Month drawing. Participants showed their completed quilts.

Many members participated in Show and Tell.

Meeting adjourned at 9:20pm.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

COK and More: Louise Morris

- Last night I mentioned that Cover our Kids is seeking a new chair person or persons to take over this important service project in January of 2018.
- COK is an integral part of who we are as members of the Bits n Pieces quilt guild, and has been for many vears!
- Salem Methodist Church of Ballwin has provided a
 place to hold our meetings and our sew days, and a
 storage facility for our fabric free of charge, because
 of our involvement in the community. This service to
 the community has drawn new members to the guild,
 gained for us a lot of respect within the community
 and by other guilt guilds, as well.
- Once home, it occurred to me that the way we organized this committee in the past, which has worked for years, is no longer feasible because of the number of new members, the increased number of quilts received, the many donations of fabric and the number of recipient organizations on our books. In order to streamline and simplify this committee, I offer some recommendations to ease the transition in 2018:
 - Accept only quilts that are completed, labeled, and, if applicable, washed (infant quilts).
 - Quilt tops could be relegated to a sew day where they would be put into quilt kits.
 - Size quilts by category, not measurement, i.e, infant, juvenile, and teen.
 - Encourage members to show their donated quilts at show-and tell and to take their own photos if desired, as COK will no longer photograph the quilts.
 - Have one person log in all completed and donated guilts as they come in.
 - Have representatives in the different zip codes, who are willing to deliver to nearby organizations take quilts home that evening and distribute them when able.
 - Decide as a committee what organizations will receive quilts and limit the number.
 - Set stricter requirements for fabric and quilt top donations.
- These are only recommendations, as the new committee would be in charge of organizing things as they see fit. So many in the guild contribute! Please let me know how you would like to be involved, from delivering guilts, to organizing sew days to chairing this com-

- CHALLENGE QUILT REVEAL and DEADLINE IS OCTOBER 24: All Challenge quilts must be completed, have a label, a hanging sleeve, and be in a pillowcase with your name on the front of the pillowcase.
- Also please be sure to accurately measure your Challenge Quilt, making sure it is no larger than 40" square.
 Then on a piece of masking or painter's tape, write the measurements down, e.g. 24" x 36", and tape that to the label on the back of your quilt over your name.
- All Challenge quilts must be <u>dropped off by</u>
 5:00 pm on October 24.

Isn't it ever so interesting how our fabric choices make such a difference in the finished product and make each quilt personal and unique? We are looking forward to seeing these finished creations in our upcoming guilt show.
- If you are looking for more information on adding creativity to your quilting or learning a new technique, your guild library has purchased a new DVD from Craftsy that may be of interest. This DVD contains the same material found in the actual classes offered by Craftsy and is on "Creative Quilting With Your Walking Foot" by

Jacquie Gering. This DVD is not just about stitching in the ditch and crosshatching but includes quilt lines that radiate and overlap to produce numerous shapes and infinite interest. Accentuate your piecing with gorgeous gentle curves, flower-like continuous curves and more. Frame a focal point with spirals, create a ripple effect with concentric circles and play off your pieced or appliquéd shapes by "echoing in". Plus, learn to quilt eye-catching text and discover tips for quilting larger projects on a smaller machine. Jacquie will show you how to quilt your projects with fresh walking foot designs for a finish you'll admire and be proud of. Be the first to check out this new dvd.

- Reports from committee members not present were as follows:
 - Susan Calzone, Sewing Machine Raffle, had not yet heard from Jackman's regarding a donation.
 - Cindy Holten, Program, Bookmark & Flyers, emailed Sarah Stevens a draft of the bookmark and flyer, and requested information on Suzanne Marshall and possible additional special exhibits.
