
HONOR FLIGHT and QUILTS OF VALOR

MINUTES

March 27, 2018

President Peggy Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of February 27, 2018. The motion passed unanimously.

President Anderson announced the newsletter deadline of March 30, 2018.

President Anderson led a discussion regarding an upgrade to Sign-Up Genius at a cost of \$100 per year. Many members had questions and comments. The Board will continue to discuss this issue.

Darla Gibson, Yahoo Group chair, explained Yahoo Group requirements for posting and joining. Any members not receiving group emails are asked to contact Darla. All posts must be approved.

Marsha Bray has DVDs with pictures of all quilts, booths and vendors from the recent quilt show for sale. The cost is \$10, of which \$7 from each sale will be given to the guild.

Treasurer Cindy Photenhauer gave a financial report on the results of the Quilt Show. There were 1532 paid admissions. Expenses are \$8,000 to-date and Income is \$17,600. Pipe and drape expenses of \$5,500 are still outstanding. She expects to have firm numbers within the month.

Quilt Show chair, Joyce Zepp, was unable to attend the night's meeting. Nancy Peters was asked to take her place.

Nancy thanked Joyce for a great job. She also recognized all quilt show chairs and volunteers.

Nancy asked ribbon winners to come to the front of the room to show and talk about their winning quilts.

Raffle quilt chair, Chris Williams, thanked Phyllis Bednarek for her extraordinary help. The quilt generated a profit of \$4,937. The two top sellers were Linda Biederman and Betty Caswell. The winning ticket was sold by Diane Brown.

The March quarterly drawing was won by Rita Niehoff. Candy Grisham's wall hanging was won by Cindy Pfotenhauer.

Sue Meyer assembled ninety baggie blocks available for pickup at the Cover Our Kids table. Bits 'N' Pieces bags are available for sale at \$15.

Cindy Pfotenhauer is chairperson for the Mystery Block of the Month. Patterns will be available on the website.

After a fifteen minute break, Chris Williams announced that the April Fun Sew Day is full. She is taking sign-ups for the May date.

President Anderson announced that June retreat deposits are due to Susan Calzone.

Louis Morris, Challenge Quilt chair, revealed the "Wanna Get Away" quilt challenge. Rules are available online.

Nancy Stratte, membership co-chair, announced that 87 people were in attendance. Two attendance prizes were awarded.

Many members participated in show and tell.

Meeting adjourned at 9:18 pm.

- This is a 6 month Mystery Quilt. Ann McNew (Attic Threads and Quilts) has designed a new Mystery Quilt for 2018 titled Diamonds are a Quilter's Best Friend. The finished size will be 60" X 70" without borders. You may use a 10-inch Layer Cake or make a scrappy guilt from your stash. Instructions will be provided each month.
- March instructions were provided at the meeting although your response was so great that I ran out of copies. Marsha has already placed them on the website under the Guild Activities tab. Block-of-the-Month.
- Feel free to join in at any time and catch up to the current month. I will be making mine along with all of you (probably 2 versions) and we will all be surprised together as we build our guilts. I am planning to have prize drawings for those who have a completed guilt top at the end.

Challenge: Louise Morris, 2018 Challenge Travel Agent

- The 2018 Challenge, "Want to get away?", will lure you on a "fabric-ulous" trip by creating travel posters of a favorite city, state, region, e.g., Amalfi Coast, New England, or province or country of your choice.
- The rules are very simple:
 - The poster is to measure 18" x 24" and may be oriented horizontally or vertically.
 - It must include the name of the locale prominently, somewhere in the poster. This can be done with fused, raw edge appliqué, or any other method you choose.
 - The poster can feature a single image, recognizable to your chosen locale, or multiple images, think: the famous landmarks of Paris, or it could also feature a city's skyline.
 - It must be an original piece for obvious copyright considerations.
 - It can have a little quilting or a lot and you can use any fabrics or embellishments you like.
 - Show where you've been or where you would love to go! Get creative, stretch your imagination, have fun!
- Of course, as you may have guessed, there will be great travel related prizes awarded to the top three posters, chosen by our panel of impartial judges, however, the aforementioned "great travel related prizes" will not include you needing to pack a suitcase.


