



## **Guild Meeting January 22, 2019**

### **What Appraisers Look For. . .and How to Improve ANY Quilt With Hallye Bone**



Hallye Bone is an appraiser of quilted textiles, certified by the American Quilter's Society in Paducah, Kentucky. Her expertise extends to repairing quilts as well as writing books about quilt-making and quilt care.

In her presentation, "What Appraisers Look for...and How to Improve ANY Quilt", she will discuss why you may need a quilt appraised and what an appraisal consists of. She will explain what appraisers are looking for and how you can make any quilt better -- the best binding, piecing,



applique, and quilting techniques and she will briefly discuss color choice as well. Bring your questions.

Hallye Bone is a native of St. Louis, Missouri. She lived in Rochester, MN, for four years and Houston, Texas for twelve years. She is quilt appraiser, certified by The American Quilter's Society, Paducah, Kentucky. She was trained by the American Folk Art Museum in New York to repair quilts and the Smithsonian Institution and worked for the Smithsonian, hanging their quilt shows. She lectures about quilts, teaches quilting techniques in St. Louis at Jackman's Fabrics, has written articles for many quilting magazines, and has written two books, "Caring for Your Quilts" and "Flower Dance" (an applique and embroidery book). She still makes lots of quilts. Hallye says, "The best part of quilting for me are the people I have met in fifty-one years of quilting. Every day I get to meet a new quilt and its interesting owner so my life is a perennial quilt show and each day is different."

- For those that are not sure what Cover Our Kids (COK) is about I will give you a short description of what we do. Basically, we collect quilts from the members of the guild and distribute them to St. Louis Children's Hospital, Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital, Foster and Adoptive Care, Epworth Family Service, and Circle of Concern. Some members just donate quilts and some work through Scraps, a mini guild group. We also have sew days that members come and help sew or cut fabric.
- At the meetings we have kits ready to be pieced or quilted. And we have a stash of fabric and batting for members to make quilts for COK. All quilts need to be washed and labeled (we have the labels).
- Stop by our table if you have any question or want to pick up a kit to finish. We always love to see new members and appreciate seeing the long standing members.
