She has enjoyed teaching others to sew for many years. creates custom quilts for my clients, is a consultant and pattern writer for a textile company, as well as helps her husband with their vintage car restoration business. Through her guild and church she makes quilts for veterans as well as local shelters and donates time and efforts to other charitable organizations.

Tonight she will tell us "Picture Piecing". "Picture Piecing" is a unique technique developed by Cynthia England, an inter-

national fiber artist, pattern designer and author, to achieve detailed quilt imagery. This is not paper piecing or foundation piecing in the traditional sense. This technique is much more! While you do use paper and straight seams, Picture Piecing has several differences, allowing quilters to achieve detailed imagery more efficiently, with less frustration and fabric waste. Best of all there is no paper to pick out, no curved or inset seams, patterns are reusable and you can CHEAT!

As a certified teacher for Cynthia England, I can teach you this technique along with tips and tricks I have learned from Cynthia herself. Also we can cover the basics of how you may create your own masterpiece from your favorite

In April I traveled to Boston to compete in the Boston Marathon. The Boston marathon is the Paducah of running. Each month more people step up to lead a committee. Cindy Pfotenauer and Margaret Gaal will be coordinating the Challenge this year. I am always up for a new challenge and am really excited about this one. Peggy Anderson is going to chair the holiday party. The quilt show committee headed by Darla Gibson is in full swing. I am thankful for all the smiling volunteers.

When committees need volunteers please consider helping - it will make you smile. Sue Meyer has planned the salad supper for July. She needs 4 people to come early that night and help with the party.

THE MINUTES

APRIL 23, 2019

- Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 7:00PM by President Jean Goldsberry. Minutes were approved by the Guild, as written. Jean started the meeting with a joke.
- 2. Announcements:
 - a. All information for the Newsletter needs to be submitted to Cindy Holten by Friday, April 26.
 - b. Thanks to those who stepped up to fill roles needed for the Guild. Cindy Pfotenhauer and Margaret Gaal will organize and run the Quilt Challenge for this year. The official kick off will be at the May meeting. Doing this Challenge will be an opportunity to hone your quilting skills.
 - c. A Holiday Party Chair is still needed for the Guild. At the meeting, Peggy Anderson and Mary Lou Knox agreed to take this job.
 - d. The Fun Sew Days for 4 May and 1 June have 2 openings. See Chris Williams tonight or contact her by phone or e-mail if you are interested.
 - e. Next COK Sew Day is 20 May.
 - f. BOM has begun. Tonight you may show Cindy Pfotenhauer your completed blocks for the drawing.
 - g. Be sure to pick up your raffle tickets. We are asking each member to sell 24 tickets.
 - 3. National Workshops: Candy Grisham talked to us about National Workshops. The 29-30 May Workshops are a Piecing Method. There is one slot still available on Thursday, 30 May 2019. The August Workshop is offered 27-28 August and is a woman who will instruct on stitching in text. There are 2 days of workshops and she will present "All About Words" at the Guild Meeting on Tuesday night.
- 4. Quilt Show: Darla Gibson stated that the first Quilt Show Meeting was held tonight. Save the Date bookmarks are available to pass around to remind folks to put the Quilt Show on their calendars. The Quilt Show will be 21-22 March 2020; Setup is 20 March. It is a great show and an opportunity to educate our community that quilting is still a wonderful hobby and a great art form. Joyce Zepp has agreed to coordinate all the group projects. Any special exhibits that should be hung together need to go through Joyce. Joyce has also set up a featured artist who will have her Judy Neimeyer guilts at the show. What is needed from the Guild is guilts. Each member needs to contribute 1.5 guilts. All levels of quilting are needed. Beginners to Grand Masters are welcome. It is a chance for our community to see what guilts can be done. To get your guilt in a show these steps are to be followed: 1) finish your quilt; 2) put a sleeve on your quilt; 3) fill out the application. Quilts need to be fairly recent; not guilts that were in the last show. Need to take a 4"x6" photograph of your guilt as part of the application process. Your quilt will not be touched while being displayed at the show. There are white gloved people who will assist viewers to see the backs of quilts. The January 2020 Guild Meeting is the last chance to put your application in for the Show.

- Margie Whitehead and Lynn DeWitt are doing the Charity Raffle. The Charity has not been approved by Queeny Park yet, so Charity is not announced. If you have small quilts or fat quarters that you would be willing to buy in a raffle, please donate them each month. Margie, Lynn, and Carol Spindler will pick up your donations each month. Darla talked a little bit about the issues we seem to be having with Google Groups.
- 5. Raffle Quilt: Pricilla Kosednar discussed Raffle Quilt tickets. The shop hop sold 318 tickets. Unfortunately, 2 other quilts were also being displayed. There are prizes for every 6 tickets that are sold. The next venue for selling is 4-5 July at Jackman's in Creve Coeur. Shifts are 10-4 on 4 July, and 10-4 on 5 July. A 1, 2, or 4-hour shift can be taken. The Sign-up Genius will be live tomorrow for the 4-5 July dates. An email will be sent out to the Guild to ask for sign-ups as a reminder. It was recommended that we also hand out Save the Date flyers/bookmarks for the Quilt Show. The quilt has been reappraised at \$15,500.00. It is in Paducah presently.
- 6. Cover Our Kids Baggie Blocks and July Salad Supper: Sue Meyer announced a drawing for a jeans bag, and a box of muffin fat quarters for everyone who has sewn baggie blocks for Cover Our Kids. Sue also announced the Summer Garden Party for our July Meeting. She asks that we dress in a flowery motif, wear a hat. We will play "Left, Right, Center", so bring 3 fat quarters in a floral pattern. She showed 2 quilts were made from her baggie blocks as they were completed and submitted to her by the Guild membership.
- Program: The Program for tonite was a Garage Sale. There were numerous tables of lots of fabric and patterns that our membership was able to buy.
- 8. Membership: Nancy Stratte and Kathy Chitwood announced that were 85 members in attendance this evening. There were no guests. Two attendance prizes were drawn.
- 9. BOM Drawing: Cindy Pfotenhauer performed the drawing for Block of the Month.
- 10. Other Announcements: Candy Grisham expressed her deepest gratitude for the kind thoughts, cards, prayers and expressions of sympathy at the recent passing of her mother. There were no additional announcements.
- Show and Tell: There were a few Show and Tell items this evening.
