MINUTES OF V-MEETING ON OCTOBER 27, 2020

President Goldsberry reported that the non-for-profit documents have been filed with the Missouri Secretary of State. She expects they will be processed in the next three weeks. After approval, the guild will file for an Employer Identification Number (EIN) and then apply for 501c(3) status.

The nominating committee members Patti Moreland and Dorothy White presented the 2021 officer nominations: President-Phyllis Bednarek and Treasurer-Debbie Reynolds.

Peggy Anderson announced that the membership committee will not accept dues payments until December. She requested that all dues be paid no later than February 2021.

Candy Grisham has arranged programs including virtual programs and workshops in May and July.

Gail Tredoux discussed upcoming programs for 2021.

Marsha Bray will handle all communications for Nighttime Needlers while Anne Perry recuperates.

Gail Tredoux reported that guild-sponsored retreats will not resume until the pandemic is over.

Darla Gipson reported that Crazy Quilters have met in the park and are still doing block exchanges.

Nancy Peters reported that Scraps members have met at her home.

Francine Boillat reported that the A-Team is not meeting, but did have a mini-quilt show at the Butter-fly House.

Jean Goldsberry thanked everyone for attending the meeting. Bits will have another Zoom meeting next month.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00pm.


The NOVEMBER 17 V-meeting will have our own master quilter, designer, and published author, Candy Grisham! She will be presenting her newest book and its sources.


Even though there were a few stumbles, for our first Bits guild V-meeting, we think we all did well.

Each month the hostess will present a "house" block. This is not a block exchange, but a year long project. We'll see that "there is no place like home".
