YOUR FANFARE OF QUILTS 2020 - March 21-22, 2020

QUILT SHOW CHAIR: Darla Gibson

- Fanfare of Quilts 2020 is right around the corner. The January meeting is going to give you more detailed information as well as the opportunity for you to volunteer for your preferred location to help! We will need EVERY guild member to make this all happen.
- Your main responsibility between now and then is to get your show entry forms completed, picture attached and to the meeting! If you cannot attend the meeting (or are concerned the weather may cause you not to get out) please make sure to MAIL your forms to Nancy Peters at the following address: Nancy Peters, 16239 Birchbrook Court, Wildwood, MO 63005
- One change we are making this year is a revamp to the set up plans. Candy Grisham is spearheading this committee of the show. The following information will help you understand the plan (and complexity) of hanging over 300 quilts! We will be discussing this more at the January meeting so please plan to join us.
- Setting up the Quilt Show Timeline:
 - Pipe and drape set up by hired contractor Friday of Quilt Show weekend. (Hope to have all set by noon.)
 - Contractor drops pipe in each cubicle for hanging along with S hooks – 2 per pole
 - Contractor drops Double pipe in small quilt area with chains and S hooks available
 - Extra chains sorted by committee and labeled
 - Quilts dropped off by members between noon and 1 PM on Friday of show. (Note: "Quilt drop off" is approximately 1 hour prior to "Designate time for Hanging")
 - Quilts placed in baskets numbered to match aisles they hang in
 - Baskets placed on benches by windows for drop off. Moved to aisles for distribution.
 - Quilts (in pillowcase) placed in assigned cubicle. (Chart)
 - At designated time for hanging: 1-4PM Friday of quilt show
 - Groups of 3-4 (preferably 4) assigned to rows starting with 100 to work together to hang that aisle.
 - Groups can be predetermined
 - Volunteers sign up to bring ladders and wheeled carts if available
 - Odd rows start at window end, even rows start at bleacher end to avoid bumping thru the drapes.
 - Two on step ladders and 1-2 to unwrap quilt and help to slide sleeve onto hanging pole.
 - Pillowcases from hung quilts folded and placed in laundry baskets according to row numbers.

- Ideally 40-50 volunteers to hang the entire show. If fewer, groups will need to finish a row and then start another after checking with coordinators.
- Art Bits to hang all Art quilts including Art Bits display
- Charts for quilts and rows available in several places and with coordinators.
- Supplies needed: Laundry baskets, step ladders (2-3 steps),

Details are still being arranged and were not available by the deadline for this article, so be looking for an email with signup information. We are always looking for additional places to sell tickets and welcome any suggestions.
- There are still a few members who have not picked up their tickets. If your schedule does not allow you to attend meetings, just call or text me and I will send them to you. Remember the Raffle Quilt is the guild's major fundraiser and happens only every two years. We hope everyone will want to participate. (My phone number is available on the Members Only area of the BitsnPieces website.)
- As always, you can get additional tickets and turn in your money at the January guild meeting. We will be announcing the current standings for the top ticket sellers.
