PRESENT DEMOS AND TRUNK SHOW


The local SAQA will have a trunk show of several small pieces of art along with demonstrations, exploration and information about SAQA from local members.

MINUTES - 28 JANUARY 2020

President Jean Goldsberry called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of November 26, 2019. The motion passed unanimously.

Show and Tell was broken into three sessions.

Darla discussed the need for volunteers in the following areas: Admissions, Back door monitor, Bed Turning, Charity Auction, Quilt Raffle, Sewing Machine Raffle, White Glove, Show Set-up and Break-down and Demo volunteers.

Publicity Chair, Laura Andrew, asked members to take and distribute quilt show bookmarks. The flyer on website is available for printing and distribution.

Margie Whitehead announced that the February meeting is the last opportunity to donate items for the charity raffle.

Tracy Back discussed show take-down procedures.

Nancy Peters discussed quilt drop-off procedures and asked for additional volunteers.

President Goldsberry asked for volunteers to coordinate the Salad Supper, Holiday Party, Raffle Quilt 2022 and 2021 Nominating Committee.

Vice-President, Gail Tredoux, asked for volunteers to set-up and takedown chairs at the monthly guild meetings.

Coordinators for Cover Our Kids, Raffle Quilt, Retreats, Fun Sew Day, UFOs, One-Day Retreats, Sunshine and Shadows and Mini-Groups all made presentations.

Attendance and Raffle Ticket Sales drawings were held and prizes awarded.

Meeting adjourned at 9:21 pm.
