It is hard to believe that the 2021 Bits and Pieces Quilt Guild year is getting for summer!! We are holding steady at168 members registered!!!!



QUILTERS' CONCERNS

When preparing your Backing for quilting, please follow these steps:

- Ensure backings are square (90°corners, parallel sides). Wonky edges are harder to attach to quilting frame.
- If backings are pieced, remove selvedges from seams. Selvedges shrink different and can cause quilt to draw up where the seam is

Quilt Show 2023 Update - Demonstrations

Continuing my subject on features of our Fanfare of Quilts. I thought I'd tell you about our Demonstrations area. We work really hard in the quilt show to make it interesting, informative and educational as well as fun and beautiful!

In the center of the arena, we hold the Bed Turning (I talked about that last month) and on the other side of the curtain, we put together an area where people can stop at the top of each hour to learn a new technique, new tools, or a new trick for quilt making! This is our Demonstration Area.

Most of our demonstrators come from our vendors – I'll talk about them in a future month. They come to the center arena and give you a quick 20 minute demo on a product or technique. Sometimes, we have our own members share a technique or trick they have learned and want to share with our members and guests.

Here are some demonstrations that we have had in past years:

- Amy Senatore of City's Edge demonstrated a Curvy Log Cabin Trim Tool
- Rene Dillard of Makanda Moon shared "Missing familiar fibers in unfamiliar ways"
- Abbey Sewing Center demonstrated their Platinum 16 sitdown Quilter
- Hallye Bone went over the Care & Repair of Quilts
- Carol Lovelace shared Art Quilt Inspirations
- Jean Goldsberry shared making the Postage Stamp Face Quilt

These are just a few of the over 50 demonstrations that have been held since 2008! You can imagine how much you can learn from so many talented guilters!

COK has found a new home for the fifty-three quilts that we received this quarter. **Boys Hope Girls Hope St. Louis** is one of 16 affiliates across the United States and Latin America, that helps academically motivated middle and high school students rise above disadvantaged backgrounds and become successful in college and beyond. The organization's goal is to graduate young people who are physically, emotionally, and academically prepared for post-secondary education and a productive life, breaking the cycle of poverty. The following elements are utilized in achieving their mission:

- Academic excellence
- Service and community engagement
- Family-like settings to cultivate youth empowerment
- Long-term and comprehensive programming
- Faith-based values
- Voluntary participant commitment

Boys Hope Girls Hope firmly believes that children have the power to overcome adversity, realize their potential, and help transform the world. Children create these successes when obstacles are removed, they are supported and believed in by caring adults, and are provided environments and opportunities that build on their strengths.

They have seven students, who are graduating this year and are headed off to college, and COK supplied them with 7 of the largest quilts (both male and female designs), so that the kids have something to snuggle in. Over the next year, COK will continue to supply Boys Hope Girls Hope with additional quilts the in-house students can use. They will be a good source for our larger quilts, since Epworth no longer answers their phone.

Donations were also made to **Rainbow for Kids** and **Great Circle**.

Don't stop working even after June 30th. There will be more prizes awarded in September with a drawing and January with more money!



THE TECH COMMITTEE CORNER

We have done so well with our online meetings averaging 100 members both times. Some helpful hints from the tech committee to make your viewing experience the best:

- Please **name** yourself and try to get **your video** up so we can see you. If you do not know how we will help.
- Please make sure your mute is on during the programs

The **interactive calendar** is on the website. Patti Moreland did a fantastic presentation about using the calendar. The calendar is on the Members only page. It is for all Bits related activities. It is also useful to see if another group is already using the Zoom account.

Bits now has a **Zoom account** for meetings and small groups. If you want to use the Bits Zoom account for a small group activity contact Patti Moreland or Rita Nyhoff to verify the calendar and get passwords. You should get a **zoom invitation** a week before the meeting and the day of the meeting. If you do not contact one of us.

We are doing **show and tell** via Zoom as well. You can send in your high-quality photos of projects you have completed. Watch for a link the week or so before the meeting.

ZOOM TIPS/TRICKS We know not everyone is a Zoom expert, so we thought we'd share some things we've learned to make your time using Zoom a little easier for our time together. At the bottom of your Zoom window, you'll see something that looks similar to the black bar below (though it may not be *exactly* the same.) Depending on your device this may be in a different place. Audio - Click on the icon to mute or unmute yourself. Click on the arrow to fine tune and test your audio choices. We ask that you keep your audio on mute while we're in the full group meeting, unless asked otherwise. Video - We love to see your faces! Click on the icon circled in red to show or not show your video. Click on the arrow to see more video options. It's our preference for you to have the video on, although ultimately, it's your choice! When/if in breakout groups, please do turn your video on so your fellow participants can see you. **Participants** - Click on the icon to open the Participants window, which includes a list of who else is taking part in the meeting. You can also change your display name here, by clicking on 'More' next to your own name. You can also click on ... in upper right of your screen to rename yourself. **Reactions** - At times, we may ask you to raise your hand, which is found when you click on Reactions. You can also clap for your fellow participants or give them a thumbs up! You're always welcome to send your questions, comments, and enthusiasms there as well! A couple of other tips: You can change your view! In the upper right of the main Zoom Screen, you'll see a couple of different icons that change depending on whether the speaker is sharing. We encourage trying out a couple of different options to find what view works best for you. Speaker view or gallery view. When a speaker is presenting they will show up as the only one on screen. Something we learned the hard way: Zoom likes a restart. The program works best on a laptop or desktop computer, and it benefits from a daily restart of your computer. Mute yourself when not speaking. Join the meeting in a quiet space. For a quick unmute, hold the space bar down on a PC Depending on where you are viewing you may need to swipe or arrow left to see everyone.
