Theme: Create a quilt that reminds you of a favorite children's book. Choose one you enjoyed as a kid or a favorite to read to your children or grandchildren or any child in your life.

Completion date: Quilts will need to be submitted to me by the middle of May 2022. I'll set up drop off/pick up places and times as we get closer. They will be displayed at the May meeting.

Size: any size up to 24" edge. If you choose to make a circular quilt, then the diameter is no larger than 24". I will entertain other size requirements if anyone would like to discuss it with me before the November meeting. I want this project to be an easily doable size.

Prizes: Yes, of course!! Attendees at the meeting will have the opportunity to vote on some categories. I'm hoping we can enjoy the quilts and guess the books they were based upon.

Other requirements:

- Your quilt should be 3 layers and quilted in some manner through all 3 layers.
- Some kind of finished edge that holds the 3 layers together at the edge (may be a raw edge)
- Be mindful of copyright requirements. Do not create a direct representation.

Embellish your hearts away. Paint fabric, add beads, make it 3-dimensional.

Fun! Fun! Fun! I'm really hoping for high participation. So many great books we've all enjoyed through the years. Let's have fun with this one!!

There's still time – but it's fast approaching! The deadline for turning your completed projects in for credit is December 31st.


I need a photo of you holding the completed project, the size, and who/how it was quilted. My e-mail is s.weible@gmail.com. Prize winners will be notified sometime in January.

Show Vendors


I am continuing my series of Quilt Show facts and information that goes into the planning and organizing of the Fanfare of Quilts Show.

At each quilt show, we have a number of vendors who support our show by renting a booth space at the show. The booth rentals help pay for the show but they also help bring in quilt show attendees! They are a huge draw to our show as they represent quilt stores locally and not so locally.

- In 2008, we had 21 vendors from as far away as Rock Hill, SC!
- <u>In 2010</u>, we had 23 vendors with a waitlist of more from as far away as Michigan!
- In 2012, we had 22 vendors from as far away as Washington!
- In 2014, we had 25 vendors from as far away as Mississippi!
- <u>In 2016</u>, we had 22 vendors from as far away as Kentucky, Tennessee and lowa!
- In 2018, we had 22 vendors from as far away as Florida!
- In 2020, we had 19 vendors scheduled from as far away as California!

It is always so much fun to go shopping at multiple shops while touring the quilts made by this incredibly talented guild. I'm really looking forward to that shopping experience again soon!

Final Report from Tamra and Gay

Cover Our Kids will make our last 2021 delivery by year's end. Our term comes to an end December 31st. The last two years have gone by quickly. Covid threw us some glitches, but we learned new ways to deal with it, developing a great respect and dependence on each other.

This year, so far, 350+ COK quilts have been delivered to ten charities and hospitals: BJC Childrens' Hospital; Boys Hope, Girls Hope; Cardinal Glennon; Circle of Concern; Epworth Children & Family Services; Foster & Adoptive Care Coalition; Great Circle; Rainbows for Kids; and St. Louis Crisis Nursery. Candy Grisham and Friends made and sent twenty-two COK labeled quilts to the Jupiter, Florida Elementary Pre-school, for their Reading Readiness program.

What an accomplishment for Bits' guild members to have created over 675 quilts for COK in the last two years. Outstanding! Carol Spindler and Nancy Peters' Scraps Mini-Group created so many quilts for the Kids that we lost count. Sorry. Gail Tredoux long-arm quilted a double-digit number of quilts. Irene DiRiscio bound a double-digit number of quilts, also. Too numerous to mention here are the many Bits' members and their friends—who gave their time, talents, and fabrics—so a deserving Kid had something all their own to love. We apologize that we can't print each name. THANK YOU ALL! Applause!

New chairpersons will be able to jump right in and hit the ground running. The generous COK budget afforded the opportunity to purchase some larger items. Three steel shelving units that have rollers. Two for better organization of fabric. The third for storing the kits. Now, the shelves roll easily to the lighted areas in the church basement.

Other purchases included: many rolls of batting; new cutting supplies, such as special batting cutting scissors and rotary blades; and fabric. Lots and lots of fabric. Multiple yards of solid colored fabrics for sashing and kid appropriate backings.

New easy patterns are printed and read. Kits are made. Some are cut fabric with patterns to be sewn together and returned to COK. But, best of all, most kits with everything needed, except quilting and thread, are ready to go. So all you quilters step right up. Kits are waiting for you. Long-arm or domestic.

Of course, we are available to help new chairpersons with any questions they have, help them get started, and explain delivery procedures. With COVID protocols in place, an appointment needs to be made before any deliveries occur.

When delivering quilts together, it meant lunch out for Gay and Tamra. Yum, Yum! We found some very good restaurants, new to both of us, names that we will share, too.

We held three cut-up days. New patterns and pre-selected fabrics from the Bits' Stash were ready for a small group of Bits' members. They used the patterns and fabrics to create top only kits. Bits' Stash has received additional fabric from someone. Thank you!

Congratulations to everyone who made our term a successful one. Covid presented challenges, but none that were insurmountable.

THE TECH COMMITTEE CORNER

We have done so well with our online meetings averaging 100 members both times. Some helpful hints from the tech committee to make your viewing experience the best:

- Please name yourself and try to get your video up so we can see you.
 If you do not know how we will help.
- Please make sure your mute is on during the programs

The **interactive calendar** is on the website. Patti Moreland did a fantastic presentation about using the calendar. The calendar is on the Members only page. It is for all Bits related activities. It is also useful to see if another group is already using the Zoom account.

Bits now has a **Zoom account** for meetings and small groups. If you want to use the Bits Zoom account for a small group activity contact Patti Moreland or Rita Nyhoff to verify the calendar and get passwords. You should get a **zoom invitation** a week before the meeting and the day of the meeting. If you do not contact one of us.

We are doing **show and tell** via Zoom as well. You can send in your high-quality photos of projects you have completed. Watch for a link the week or so before the meeting.

ZOOM TIPS/TRICKS We know not everyone is a Zoom expert, so we thought we'd share some things we've learned to make your time using Zoom a little easier for our time together. At the bottom of your Zoom window, you'll see something that looks similar to the black bar below (though it may not be *exactly* the same.) Depending on your device this may be in a different place. Audio - Click on the icon to mute or unmute yourself. Click on the arrow to fine tune and test your audio choices. We ask that you keep your audio on mute while we're in the full group meeting, unless asked otherwise. Video - We love to see your faces! Click on the icon circled in red to show or not show your video. Click on the arrow to see more video options. It's our preference for you to have the video on, although ultimately, it's your choice! When/if in breakout groups, please do turn your video on so your fellow participants can see you. **Participants** - Click on the icon to open the Participants window, which includes a list of who else is taking part in the meeting. You can also change your display name here, by clicking on 'More' next to your own name. You can also click on ... in upper right of your screen to rename yourself. **Reactions** - At times, we may ask you to raise your hand, which is found when you click on Reactions. You can also clap for your fellow participants or give them a thumbs up! You're always welcome to send your questions, comments, and enthusiasms there as well! A couple of other tips: You can change your view! In the upper right of the main Zoom Screen, you'll see a couple of different icons that change depending on whether the speaker is sharing. We encourage trying out a couple of different options to find what view works best for you. Speaker view or gallery view. When a speaker is presenting they will show up as the only one on screen. Something we learned the hard way: Zoom likes a restart. The program works best on a laptop or desktop computer, and it benefits from a daily restart of your computer. Mute yourself when not speaking. Join the meeting in a quiet space. For a quick unmute, hold the space bar down on a PC Depending on where you are viewing you may need to swipe or arrow left to see everyone. Thanks, Candy, Gail, Gail, Marsha & Darla
