ZOOM MEETING & IN PERSON MINUTES JANUARY 25, 2022 Teresa Basler, Secretary

President Phyllis Bednarek opened the meeting at 7:00pm via zoom. 15 members were in attendance at Salem Methodist Church and 57 virtually.

Presenter: Ann Rucksford from Great Circle. Tamara Phelps and Gay Stewart, COK program coordinators introduced the program speaker. Great Circle is one of the charities that receives COK quilts. Ann shared the purpose of Great Circle and about the recipients of quilts.

Tamara and Gay were acknowledged and thanked for managing COK. Tamara and Gay thanked members that made quilts and helped pick up kits and quilts. They noted that the last couple of years have been challenging yet successful.

After the program, President Bednarek called the meeting to order. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of November 23, 2021.

The President reported the following:

- The proposed budget was reviewed. Questions were asked and answered. A
 motion was made to approve the 2022 budget and seconded. The guild is a nonprofit, not an LLC. The issue of insurance is being investigated.
- All newsletter **submissions** are due by Friday, January 28, 2022 at 5pm.
- Registration for 2022 membership is open. The form will be available on the Bits website.
- Quilt Raffle: There is a need for someone to take over the quilt raffle. This includes ordering tickets and set up showings.
- Retreat Organizer: there is a need for a retreat coordinator.
- **Membership**: 5 new members joined the guild this year. Priscilla Kosednar and Jane Dodge are taking over membership. Renewals are due now. If changes in address, phone numbers or email, please share that information. We have 115 members as of 1/20/22.
- Programs: Patti Moreland outlined programs scheduled for the first half of 2022.
 If you want to see a technique demonstrated or have a program idea, contact
 Patti Moreland.
- Challenge Quilts will be collected in May and voted on at the June meeting. See details in newsletter.
- **UFO projects**: Submit a UFO form by March 15. Form on website.
- Joyce Zepp and Laura Khoury are the new COK coordinators. Help is always needed to help cutting fabric for kits, delivering or picking up quilts and making quilts.
- Fun Sew Days: Mary Lou Knox announced the next in-person sew date is February 5th at the fire station. If there are not enough people to attend in-person, then it will be virtual. Even months are in-person. Chris Williams does virtual on odd-months.
- Quilt Show Start Up: Darla Gibson. Seeking volunteers for demos at quilt show.
 Volunteers are needed for special exhibits, volunteer coordinators, organize demos and the sewing machine raffle. More info at the March meeting.
- **Upcoming Quilt Show**: Candy Grisham shared that the Art Bit's group is doing an exhibit; "Reflection Reimagined" from Feb 3- March 17, at Longview M-F 9-4
- Show & Tell: Darla presented a slide show of member guilting projects.
- Website: Check each area and send any changes/updates to Marsha.

Attendance prizes for in-person and virtual members were awarded.



Theme: Create a quilt that reminds you of a favorite children's book. Choose one you enjoyed as a kid or a favorite to read to your children or grandchildren or any child in your life.

Completion date: Quilts will need to be submitted to me by the **middle of May 2022**. I'll set up drop off/pick up places and times as we get closer. They will be displayed at the June meeting.

Size: any size up to 24" edge. If you choose to make a circular quilt, then the diameter is no larger than 24". I will entertain other size requirements if anyone would like to discuss it with me before the November meeting. I want this project to be an easily doable size.

Prizes: Yes, of course!! Attendees at the meeting will have the opportunity to vote on some categories. I'm hoping we can enjoy the quilts and guess the books they were based upon.

Other requirements:

- Your quilt should be 3 layers and quilted in some manner through all 3 layers.
- Some kind of finished edge that holds the 3 layers together at the edge (may be a raw edge)
- Be mindful of copyright requirements. Do not create a direct representation.

Embellish your hearts away. Paint fabric, add beads, make it 3-dimensional.

Fun! Fun! Fun! I'm really hoping for high participation. So many great books we've all enjoyed through the years. Let's have fun with this one!!

Over the past several months, I have been sharing the various aspects of the quilt show with you. Now, it is time to begin the actual planning! And, I need help! As I mentioned in the various articles, it does really take a village to make this event happen!

I'd like to thank the committee members that have agreed to return for another year of planning. I really appreciate you stepping forward. I'd also like to thank those that have decided they cannot help this time, your work in the past is greatly appreciated!

Right now, there are four positions that I'd like to get filled:

<u>Special Exhibits</u> – This person will source and contract a special quilting exhibit to be shown at our Fanfare of Quilts. The exhibit should be something that is nationally or regionally recognized that would draw people to our show.

<u>Volunteers</u> – This person will coordinate the schedule of our guild volunteers during the weekend of the show. Typically, this is coordinated through an app called Sign Up Genius.

In Memoriam – This person will coordinate with the families of the members that have passed away since our last show. You will work with the family on a short bio and one piece of their quilting work that represents them to display at the show.

Sewing Machine Raffle – Jackman's graciously donates a sewing machine for us to raffle at each show. This person will coordinate with Jackman's to get the sewing machine, and coordinate the booth for the machine raffle.

Again, there will be a few more positions as we progress toward the show and I will continue to post them in the newsletter as well as announce them in the monthly guild meetings.

Those that volunteer are committing to attending the planning session meetings held monthly starting in February; and if unable to attend (because we know you have other things too) give me an update prior to the meeting on your area. You will also need to be available the weekend of the show (March 17 – 19, 2023) to take care of any of the details regarding your area.

Please note you will have all the notes and learnings from past committee members as we have a very organized manner to keep this information and share it forward – so you are not starting from scratch. You also have a ton of expertise on the Show Committee to assist with ideas and helping hands if needed.

QUILTERS' CONCERNS

Judy Vogt, Professional Long Arm Quilter

If you are going to quilt on your domestic machine, you can prepare your quilt by hand or pin basting.

Lay your backing fabric on a table or floor wrong side up. Place painter's tape on the corners and as needed around edges. Do not overly stretch, but you want it flat. Next place your batting on top of the backing. Place your top on next and tape corners and sides as needed to keep it flat.

Using curved basting pins, place about every three to four inches to hold layers together. Or if you want to hand baste, use a single thread and baste across spacing stitches about every three to four inches. Usually doing rows is all you need. A grid pattern can be done for extra security of pieces from moving.

As you quilt an area, the basting stitches or pins should be removed

We have done so well with our online meetings averaging 100 members both times. Some helpful hints from the tech committee to make your viewing experience the best:

- Please name yourself and try to get your video up so we can see you.
 If you do not know how we will help.
- Please make sure your mute is on during the programs

NOTE: One very important step is to make sure you are named when you enter. Not "ipad" or your child/grandchild but your name.

We are carefully watching to make sure no one "hacks" into our meetings and it is so very helpful to know who you are.
