<u>GUILD ZOOM MEETING MINUTES</u> <u>JUNE 28, 2022</u> Teresa Basler, Secretary

Phyllis Bednarek opened the meeting. She explained that her absence has been due to a back injury. It was good to see Phyllis and everyone wishes her a speedy recovery.

Joyce Zepp coordinated the Children Book Quilt Challenge. She described each of the 11 submitted quilts. Attendees (both in-person and on-line) were given time to review the entries and vote. Prizes will be given for the top three.

To give Phyllis time to get home and on Zoom, Darla presented this month's Show and Tell.

Minutes were approved as written and seconded with one minor correction. Change -Mary Lou was referred to as Mary Jo. Changes will be made to last month's minutes.

A private \$200 donation was received. A family sent a donation to our guild in appreciation for help with hand quilting. The finished quilt is to be donated to Siteman Cancer Center.

UFO - first deadline is tonight. The winner will be announced at the July meeting. Additional 2022 UFO's can be submitted for December.

The St. Louis Modern Quilt show is July 16 (10am-5pm) and July 17 (11am-4pm). Check their website for more information. There's no entry fee, but a suggested donation of \$7 would be appreciated.

2022 Future Programs - Patty Moreland - -

Global Quilt Sampler - July 30-31. A PDF was sent describing sessions. Afterwards, it will be evaluated to see if we want to continue participating in future programs.

Upcoming programs:

- July Honor Flight Salad/Supper This will be an In-Person gathering only at the guild church-no Zoom. Judy Humphrey will share her Honor Flight experiences. Each member should bring our own salad. Paper products, drinks, prizes, desserts will be provided. The start time is 6:30pm.
- August. Textile Journey Making Rope Bowls class. The class is full but you can sign up on a wait list.

Sept - Round Robin demo's - more to come.

Oct. - Santa Suit Quilt presentation. You can also purchase their book for \$10 (a reduced cost).

Raffle Quilt – Megan Buttery reminded the members that the quilt raffle is one of the biggest fundraisers for the guild. If someone wants to send Megan a check for raffle tickets, she will complete the tickets per their instructions. SHOP SALES - Watch for emails with Signup Genius links to get scheduled to help with shop sales. She needs a volunteer for Itchin to be Stitch'n on Monday, July 11, 11am-1pm.

Charity Raffle – Sue Meyer announced that Sew Hope Sewing Room will be our charity organization this year. They are charming people devoted to teach people how to sew 9 - 90 ages. Still need donations such as small mini quilts, baskets and patterns.

Retreats – Teresa Basler gave a report on the June 3-6, 2022 retreat at Itch'n to be Stitch'n. Everyone had a great time and had fun working on projects. Additional retreats are scheduled for 2022 and into 2023. Signup Genius will be set up. Watch for emails announcing when to sign up. So that others have a chance to attend a retreat, we ask that if you attended the last retreat, wait three days before signing up. If there are still openings after three days, then the retreat is open to all guild members.

Quilt Entry Forms - Darla Gibson - Entry Forms for quilt show will be ready soon. If you haven't already done so, please pick up your 2020 quilt form(s).

Sew Day – Mary Lou Knox announced the next In-Person sew day to be Aug 6th from 9:30am-4pm. She also acknowledged and thanked those that helped with set-up & breakdown of the church/guild meeting space.

Joyce Zepp announced the Children's Book Quilt Challenge: Peggy Anderson won 1st place, Joyce Zepp won 2nd place, Teresa Basler won 3rd place. All entries were fun and unique. Thanks to everyone who submitted an entry.

The 2022 Storybook Challenge Results

The challenge was to create a quilt, no larger than 24" x 24", depicting a favorite children's book. Ten people took on the challenge, one member making two, resulting in 11 wonderful quilts!

The Guild members attending the meeting in person and via zoom voted for their favorite quilt.

The Prize winners were:

First place went to **Peggy Anderson**, who received a \$75 gift certificate to Quilted Fox. **Second place** went to **Joyce Zepp**, who received a \$50 gift certificate to Quilted Fox. **Third place** went to **Teresa Basler**, who received a \$25 gift certificate to Quilted Fox.

FIRST PLACE

<u>Peggy Anderson's</u> quilt featured hand-dyed fabric, hand embroidery, applique, trapunto, and thread painting. It was embellished with lace, gauze, and felted wood. Her book was called <u>My Little Book House.</u>



SECOND PLACE

Joyce Zepp chose <u>The Lion, the</u> <u>Witch, and the Wardrobe</u> as her subject. She used piecing, applique, and hand embroidery. The threedimensional quilt was embellished with sequins, beads and glitter, and there was both hand and machine quilting.

THIRD PLACE


<u>Teresa Basler</u> gave us <u>Rainbow Fish</u>, using hand embroidery and threedimensional appliques. The quilt was embellished with buttons, trim, yarn, netting, and silk leaves.

<u>Debbie Reynold's</u> depiction of <u>Dragons Love</u> <u>Tacos</u> featured machine applique, machine embroidery, and machine quilting. She used thread painting, and the dragon's spikes were three-dimensional.



Jean Goldsberry machine pieced and quilted a <u>Seek and Find</u> activity quilt.



<u>Mickie Compton</u> brought <u>The Little House in</u> <u>the Big Woods</u> to life, and featured appliqued Mary and Laura carrying baskets of grapes up to the cabin. The quilt was quilted by machine.



<u>Nancy Peters</u> embellished <u>The Little House</u> with lace, buttons and beads. It was quilted by machine.

Lillian Nehring depicted <u>East of the Sun and</u> <u>West of the Moon</u>. The quilt was pieced and embellished with buttons and beads. The quilting was by machine.



<u>Darlene Kopta</u> took us to <u>Where the Wild</u> <u>Things Are</u> with raw edge applique, hand embroidery, stuffing, and three-dimensional aspects. The quilt was embellished with shells, jewels, and glitter. There was both hand and machine quilting.



<u>Kate Hall</u> was inspired to make two quilts. For her <u>Little Red Hen</u> quilt, she showed her painting talents, and . . .



Kate Hall's The Big Orange Splot featured applique. Both quilts were machine pieced and quilted.

Tech Committee News

We learn something new all the time! As we continue to transition to in-person meetings, we really appreciate your patience and feedback. Sometimes everything works great and sometimes we need tweaks. That being said, please remember to **show respect** for everyone's choices. Watching the presentations from home or being present for the meeting are ways to be involved with OUR quilt guild and are personal choices. There will be future meetings with live show and tell and salad suppers and we will eventually return to a new normal. In the meantime, we will continue to offer ways to attend that work for as many as possible.

Helpful Hints to Zoom By

We have done so well with our online meetings averaging 100 members both times. Some helpful hints from the tech committee to make your viewing experience the best:

- Please **name** yourself and try to get **your video** up so we can see you. If you do not know how we will help.
- Please make sure your mute is on during the programs

NOTE: One very important step is to make sure you are named when you enter. Not "ipad" or your child/grandchild but your name.

We are carefully watching to make sure no one "hacks" into our meetings and it is so very helpful to know who you are.

The **interactive calendar** is on the website. Patti Moreland did a fantastic presentation about using the calendar. The calendar is on the Members only page. It is for all Bits related activities. It is also useful to see if another group is already using the Zoom account.

Bits now has a **Zoom account** for meetings and small groups. If you want to use the Bits Zoom account for a small group activity contact Patti Moreland or Rita Nyhoff to verify the calendar and get passwords. You should get a **zoom invitation** a week before the meeting and the day of the meeting. If you do not contact one of us.

We are doing **show and tell** via Zoom as well. You can send in your high-quality photos of projects you have completed. Watch for a link the week or so before the meeting.
