FABRICSCAPES: PAINTING WITH FABRIC By David Walker

Our program in April will be presented by Dave Walker, who is an award-winning, Juried Best of Missouri Hands, fabric collage artist who makes unique and creative works of art from commercial fabrics.

David Walker

Dave has a BSE in Art Education and years of experience making and creating fabric collages. His "fabricscapes" have been featured in galleries across Missouri and are currently displayed in patrons' homes and Hospitals from Florida to Alaska.

The Program Title is Fabricscapes: Painting with Fabric. This program shows examples of fabric collages that are made using a raw edge appliqué technique, double iron on bonding, and free motion sewing. Each work depicts a story of travel, a record of time or an impression from nature, either real or pictured in memory. The process of creating landscapes out of fabric (fabricscapes) will be explained.

<u>Cover Our Kids (COK)</u> – Diana Priess shared that the first Sew Day had 14 in attendance and 2 came to pick up kits to sew at home. There were 2 learning stations and lots of sewing. The next **COK Sew Day is Wednesday, June 5th 9:30-2:30**. The theme is "School's Out – Let's Sew Sweet Treats for the Kids". COK is in need of 2 yds or larger of backing fabric. There will be a quarterly drawing for prizes.

There were 36 quilts turned in last month; Carol delivered 6, 11 went to Our Lady's Inn, and 19 went to Ranken Jordan Pediatric Bridge Hospital – THANK YOU!

If you're interested in making larger quilts for older kids – twin size for hospital beds (70" x 90" +/-) or adult quilts for Our Lady's Inn and Foster Care closet, COK will donate whatever they receive.

Baggy Blocks – Sue Meyer showed a completed quilt top made from baggy blocks. Take a baggie or two and whip up some blocks.

<u>Honor Flight</u> - Judy Humphrey gave statistics: donated 62 quilts to group on April 2. She has enough for the June flight. Judy has premade kits – pick one up or make your own. Requirements are patriot (or red/white/blue) fabric and dimensions about 36" x 36".

Our first 2024 COK Sew Day was a Huge Success thanks to those who worked behind the scenes as well as those who attended!! 14 attendees made it a Perfect Day! Jelly Donuts for our Jelly Roll Race and Spring Hyacinths and Tulips as prizes to support our "Spring into Action!" Theme.

Candy organized a station for demonstrating how to make Hanging Sleeves and Facing for our Route 66 Challenge pieces, as well as our 2025 Quilt Show. She also demonstrated how to fuse our Batting Scraps for COK Quilts!

Sara also organized a station demonstrating how to stitch our Batting Scraps together on our domestic machines. So much we learned, and So Much Fun!! Some participants had so much fun, they even took home extra kits to make at home! Thank You to All!!

Speaking of kits, we still have some left! And they are precut! So all you have to do is Sew! We will have them available at our April Guild meeting, so stop on by and pick up 1 or 2, and get started on your fun, creative, and beautiful creation for our kiddos!

Speaking of donations, we had so many beautiful completed, washed, and labeled quilts turned in at our March meeting...49 in all! Plus 12 Pieced Tops to be Quilted! That is incredible! Thank You for your amazing contributions!

And if you are a Quilter or you enjoy Binding, we have many ready for you. Please pick up from our station at our next meeting. And No Pressure! We are All busy! So, please know if you pick up a Kit or Pieced Top to be Quilted or Quilt to be Bound, there is no time limit! You are welcome to take as long as you need to get these back to us! We are a patient, understanding bunch!

Also, at our last meeting, we discussed the needs for larger quilts. Our name is officially "Cover Our Kids & More", and I am finding the "& More" is just as important. The need in our community is great, and I am amazed how many "safe houses" our area has for parents and children who are victims of domestic abuse. Additionally there are community homes for children without a family, without foster care or adoption, who feel lost and unloved.

Also, we are blessed to have several childrens' hospitals in our area; St Louis Childrens' Hospital, Cardinal Glennon Childrens' Hospital, Mercy Pediatric Hospital, Shriners Hospital, and Ranken Jordan Pediatric Bridge Hospital. We also have several Ronald McDonald Houses throughout the area, which house families from other cities and towns who have no place to stay while their child is in the hospital. The needs in this facility are not only for crib size quilts, but quilts for the older sick and injured patients who are in hospital beds, some for extended periods of time.

I have listed the Standard Quilt Sizes below. Please know we still want and need those baby and crib-size quilts too!!

- Queen: 90" by 108"
- Full/Double: 85" by 108"
- ♥ Twin: 70" by 90"
- ♥ Throw: 50" by 65"
- Crib: 36" by 52"
- Infant: 36" by 40"

Note: These are just a guide! Your work is a Creative Gift from the Heart! Please know it will be Needed and Loved no matter what the size!!

Our next **COK Sew Days**!! We still have 2(!) full days to get together, laugh and sew, and make some quilts for our kiddos in need. They are as follows:

Biography


Dave Walker, a 1968 Chillicothe High School graduate, has always felt drawn to the colors, textures, and possibilities of fabric. He began his fiber art journey constructing quilt tops. Eventually he felt constricted by patterns designed by others and in 2009 came up with the idea to use leftover quilting scraps to make landscapes. Over time, the process of cutting up, layering and piecing fabric scraps evolved into works of art he calls Fabricscapes. Dave employs a "bond and sew" technique of raw edge machine appliqué, textile painting, and thread-work using free motion sewing to complement the design and hold the collage together on a muslin backing. All pieces are framed and matted for easy hanging and depict a story of travel, a record of time, or an impression from nature. Fabricscapes have been featured in galleries throughout Missouri and can be found in patrons' homes from Florida to Alaska.

Dave is proud to be a Juried Best of Missouri <u>Hands</u> Artist and has received many awards and recognitions from shows across the state. He has a BSE in Art Education from Northeast Missouri State University (now known as Truman State University).

Dave served 40 years as a Nursing Home Administrator and later a traveling LongTerm Care Consultant. Driving through rural Missouri he collected images and ideas for future fabricscapes. Now retired, Dave resides with his wife, Julie, in Columbia, MO. His work is available for purchase at Art off the Trail in Rocheport, MO and Serendipity Salon and Gallery in Columbia MO.

Learn how to make a fabric landscape from award-winning, Juried Best of Missouri Hands, David Walker, Fabriscapes.



Each student will create their own unique <u>no-sew</u> 18"x24" landscape collage during class. David will present a slide show of fabric collage examples to inspire students. David will demonstrate the raw edge applique technique. The workshop kit includes bonding material and a large selection of fabrics to select from for the class project.

The class project will be ready to quilt at home, frame and hang in a place of pride in your home.

Supply List:

Paper cutting scissors


Fabric scissors

Optional – Solid, prints, and batik fabric scraps suitable for landscape land, skies, trees and water. Fabrics should be in a variety of light to dark shades of green, blue, and brown. Scraps of fabric with houses, barns, animals or objects of interest such as fences, flowers, trees, shrubs, can also be incorporated.
