
### **UFOs - (Unfinished Objects)**


Minimum Quilt size is 36" by 36", and Maximum is around 70" by 90".

If you have Backing Fabric in your stash for your Pieced Quilt Top, by all means include it! Pieced Backing is Acceptable also.


