

ARE BITS QUILTERS VULNERABLE TO SCAMS

Why are you a target for Scammers...Because someone may perceive you as old and vulnerable. I came to this awareness recently in reading an article about women seeking a Friend which resulted in a "pig butchering scam". Or in my personal case, I received phone calls from ALL over this nation wanting to help me with unpaid taxes. Who knew that Mark in Wincobie, Washington, could offer outstanding service to relieve my tax debt AND who wanted to help me

Reality Check Girls . . .

Just because you have grey hair or are single or widowed you certainly are NOT foolish.

Some ideas to empower your safety:

- Scam calls are strong but you can place you name on a No Call List (do again as updates do matter) https://agomo.gov/app/NoCallRegistration or phone 866-289-9633.
- I did call the Missouri Attorney General office to report the scam and as messages were left, I included the scam numbers given. At least I reported and felt I took care of ME. AND I have no unpaid taxes....aargh.
- Pig butchering scam: The scammer gains a victim's trust over a prolonged period of time. They Fatten them up (flowers sent etc. to you) and then they go in for the kill (your money and savings) for little things like car repair and more.
- So Ladies, talk and listen to each other, be sensitive to life's impact on that quilter, watch out for each other and review with your family or trusted finance/attorney how to protect yourself.
- THINK: if I give my money to that man, will I limit my ability to shop at the fabric sale? You KNOW your priorities!! Missouri Shop Hop!
