

Important Information About Membership Dues

If you were one of the 93 in attendance at our October meeting you know we voted to raise our membership dues. Annual membership dues will now be \$35 beginning in 2025. Our guild strives to provide quality programming with National Speakers for our members and charity quilts for the community. These expenses, along with the other expenses to run a guild, have been rising and dues have not changed for many years. We will begin our Membership Renewal January 1, 2025 and at that time be able to start accepting credit card payments through our new Square processing technology. You can pay in person at the January meeting OR Online through the Membership Tab at our website. It's very simple:

- Go to the guild website: www.bitsnpiecesguild.com.
- Click on the Membership tab in the black heading at the top
- On the Membership page you will see a large BLUE button that says "Buy Now".
- That button will take you to a the first checkout page. There is a \$1.50 surcharge for using this easy service (but you won't have to pay for postage or envelope!) The total is \$36.50.
- Click on the BLUE Checkout button and fill in the rest of your payment information.
- At the bottom of this second checkout page there is one more BLUE button to click that says "Pay 36.50"
- You will receive an email receipt immediately. EASY PEASY!

We will be notified of your payment with your name, email and phone number. With that information we will check your email and phone numbers for updates to our membership directory. If your home address has changed from the one listed on the online membership list, please email Beth Roehm at bethroehm57@gmail.com with your new address so she can update our online directory.

If you would rather write a check you can go to that same membership page from above and at the bottom of the page there is a BLUE link to download the "Bits Membership Form 2024" Please print off that form, fill it in, enclose payment (check made out to Bits 'n' Pieces Quilt Guild) and send it to the Salem Methodist Church address listed on the form.

Any checks for membership renewal received before the end of the year 2024 **will not be cashed** until the new year for accounting purposes. You may bring renewal in December but it will not be processed until January.

You must be a dues paying member to participate in the Fanfare of Quilts Quilt Show in March.

Our guild is 243 members strong and looking forward to a new year 2025 filled with a big quilt show, great programming, small groups and retreats and many opportunities to serve the community by sharing cozy quilts. So get ready to renew your membership on January 1st, 2025!

GUILD MEETING MINUTES October 22, 2024

President Candy Grisham called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Program: Quilt Show - Candy Grisham showed a video on How to Put on a Quilt Sleeve by Bonnie at AQS. You can find the video on the Guild website.

Darla Gibson passed out Quilt Show registration forms and went over how to fill them out. You can also use the online forms located at the top of the Guild home page. If you turn in your forms online, you will receive a confirmation email.

Registration forms are due no later than January 15th. If using the paper forms, it was suggested that you bring them to the December meeting to avoid postal delays with the holidays.

You can prioritize which quilts you want in the show by numbering each entry. Quilts must be completed (including sleeve) by March 1. *Route 66 Quilts do not need a form. Wendy will be handling those. Thanks Wendy!

A new option on the form: "This Quilt is For Sale". The Guild will not be part of the sale in any way. You will be contacted directly by the prospective buyer. Darla also mentioned that this is a Quilt Show, not a Quilt Sale so please don't try to sell every quilt you show.

Patti Moreland gave an update to volunteer opportunities. There will be Drop-Off, Valet and Set-Up assignments. Volunteers are needed to hang quilts on Friday. We will need 18 wagons, 12 -18 baskets and several stepladders.

Lisa Smith will be coordinating volunteers through Sign Up Genius. In January you will get an invite. If you don't have a Sign Up Genius account, you can make one after you sign up. There will be opportunities for all – some are seated. Candy reminded us that if you are not stable on a stepladder, please don't try it! There are many other things that need to be done that don't require using a ladder.

Darla Gibson announced: AND if you sign up to work at the Quilt Show, you get in FREE!

Budget – President Candy Grisham discussed our budget and membership dues. Dues have been \$25/yr. for over 10 years. Candy proposed that starting the 2025 session, our dues be raised to \$35/yr. Tracy Back made a motion and Karen Grogan seconded it. Candy then proposed the increase to the members; a large majority voted in the affirmative.

Membership - Please turn in Membership dues by February meeting. You can bring a check or cash to a meeting, mail a check, or pay on our Guild website. If paying online please do so after January 1, 2025. Thank You!

Programs – Debbie Reynolds announced a change in the 2025 schedule. January will now be Demos. If you are interested in demonstrating a quilting technique or tip, please contact Debbie. Candy announced the April Workshop; Mini Rings with Sew Kind of Wonderful rulers.

Nominating Committee – Tracy Back presented the nominees for officers for 2025-2027 season. President: Patti Moreland and Treasure: Kay Stevenson

Raffle Quilt Tickets – Candy Grisham shared that top seller, Chris Ortbals, has sold about 1500 tickets so far. The time was turned over to Chris so she could share her enthusiasm and tips for selling raffle tickets. Share our Guild's story, be sincere, ask them engaging questions and have cookies and Super Ticket Packs in your purse wherever you go! Chris showed us her beautiful quilt made up of photos of everyone that bought a Super Ticket Pack. Chris said, "You just need to show others how they can help in the community through our Guild."

Barb Nagel gave an update on Raffle Ticket sales; over 7500 tickets have been sold. She encouraged us to meet a goal of 10,000 or more. Barb has a large photo and framed info you can use to sell at work, etc. Let her know if you want to borrow it.

COK – Diana Preiss reported on the Fall Frolic sewing day. There was a great turnout with 15 people in attendance. We have around 100 quilt tops that need to be quilted. Please pick up one, or more and hold on to any pieced quilt tops you have for now. Many quilts have been delivered to Crisis Nursery, Forward Bound and KVC foster care. 368 quilts have been donated so far this year! Diana shared a letter from Evelyn's House, a hospice facility for terminally ill patients of all ages. They are requesting donations; quilts 54" x 65" minimum. Diana will be meeting their needs with your help.

During the November 12th meeting you can pick out a quilt if you know someone that is in need in our community. Be thinking about who you can share a quilt with! You can follow up with the Guild by sharing who you were able to help.

Mercy Pediatric Hospital is still in need of bereavement quilts.

Drawings – Prizes were awarded for the Raffle Tickets Sales, Fat Quarter and Membership.

I want to take a moment here and make the formal announcement! I am so sorry I missed this in the last newsletter. The Fanfare of Quilts Committee is pleased to announce that Candy Grisham will be our guild's Featured Quilter at our Show in March 2025. Candy is most deserving of this title with her work for the guild over many years, her beautiful quilts and her work in the quilting community with pattern and book creation.
