Program - Rhonda Pierce from Schmetz Needles was our guest speaker via Zoom. She taught us about needle anatomy, the Schmetz needle system and specific needles for all your sewing needs. See recent email for handouts from meeting.

<u>Route 66 Badges</u> – Wendy Richards announced that those participated in the Route 66 challenge received a badge with their quilt on it. Please wear to the Quilt Show and at other quilting events.

COK – Diana expressed much gratitude to all of you that donated batting and backing fabric. In April there will be fat quarter bundles available as a thank you to those that donated.

Baggie Blocks - Sue Myer shared info on what baggie and orphan blocks are, showed samples of finished quilt tops using them. She encouraged us to make some or go through and donate our orphan blocks.

2025 Challenge – Harriet Zipfel announced the theme and parameters of this year's guild challenge quilt. Use black and white fabric(s) and one other color fabric Quilt must be 3 layers Dimensions of quilt must be in multiples of 3; the smallest size is 3"x3" and the largest size is 18"x18" (for example 6"x9", 12"x12", 9"x18", etc) Embellishments can be any color Due Date: November Meeting Members will vote on Top 3 winners

Quilt Show – Darla gave updates for the upcoming Quilt Show; there are 18 days until the show!

Reminder: Volunteers don't pay to enter quilt show. If you are volunteering, please dress casual nice – no denim and wear your name badge. Go to the volunteer table 15 minutes before shift when arriving. 31 Vendors this year – lots of shopping! Picking up your quilts will be first come, first served this year in the warming area. Our Quilt Show will be highlighted in West County Magazine's March 12 issue.

Membership – There were 115 in attendance tonight and 4 new members signed up! There are 228 total members that have paid this year's dues. Prizes were awarded.

Cover Our Kids & More Quilt Guidelines

- Minimum Size: 36" by 36" (Bereavement Quilts can be 24" by 36")
- ♥ Maximum Size: 84" by 84"
- For Pieced Tops to be Quilted, please Secure All Seams along the Outer Perimeter of your Pieced Quilt Top: Please Back Stitch or Sew a "Victory Lap" around the perimeter of the Pieced Top (This avoids seams separating when quilted.)
- Please Wash All Finished Quilts in Fragrance-Free Detergent. Avoid Stains, Pet Hairs, and/or Smoke Odor.
- Sew our Label in any corner of your quilt, on the reverse side.

Optional for your Pieced Top: Include Backing and/or Batting (Much Appreciated!)

- ♥ Maximum Size: 48" by 48"

Bits n Pieces Quilt Guild 2025 Challenge

This year the theme is black and white and red all over! Well, not exactly. This year your challenge is to select black and white fabrics and pair them with a fabric the color of your choice.

Guidelines:

♥The fabrics can be solids or prints.

♥You chose the color of fabric you want to pair with black and white.

♥The quilt dimensions can range from 3" to 18". No quilt should be greater than 18" on a side.

♥Quilts should measure in increments of 3". so 3", 6", 9",12",and 18" are acceptable dimensions.

♥Quilts must consist of three layers. Three dimensional quilts will be accepted.

♥Quilts that do not meet these guidelines will not be eligible for vote or awards. (But we can display and admire your work anyway!)

Due Date:

The November 2025 Guild meeting.

Awards:

The membership at the November 2025 meeting will vote for first, second and third place quilts. Prizes will be awarded to the people who made the top three quilts.

Bit n Pieces 2025 Workshops

There are many opportunities for everyone this year with four different workshops scheduled. I am working out the details and will have samples and sign ups at upcoming meetings but here is the tentative schedule:



April 10, 2025 - Norma Stark

Mini Rings A Sew Kind of Wonderful mini ruler workshop, 33 x 44"

In addition, she is speaking and doing a different workshop with Hearts n Hands in O'Fallon, IL that week and we are welcome to sign up (after members) and come to the program.



June 25th, 2025 - <u>Danielle</u> of Warm n Cozy in Columbia, IL "Master Your Stripology Ruler"

This is doing a full day workshop. It will take you beyond just cutting strips, squares and rectangles with your Stripology rulers! Learn to utilize the ruler for 1/4" and 1/8" inch increment cutting, squaring up blocks, cutting 45 degree and 60 degree angles, making basic quilt elements such as a Half-square Triangles and Flying Geese, and more!

September 24, 2025 <u>Leila Gardunia</u> Mini Mirrored Diamonds This will be a full day workshop teaching beautiful foundation piecing with one of her patterns. Pattern required.



October 29, 2025 <u>Erin Grogan</u> Big Stitch Quilting This will have a 2 hour workshop. Big Stitch Quilting is something many have wanted to learn and what a great opportunity to see ideas, threads and a demo.
