Mac Barnes is currently a junior computer science student at Washington university in St. Louis with a Second Major in Studio Art as part of the Beyond Boundaries interdisciplinary studies program.

Outside of the classroom, mac works on his work as a quilt artist having shown in over 7 states in local and national venues like the QuiltCon, the North Carolina Contemporary Art Museum as well as international publications like SAQA Journal and Patchwork Professional. His work uses the comforts and memories we have around quilts to tell often difficult or complex stories of the human experience including his own as a queer artist through digitally interactive quilts made of recycled materials.

Mac has taught multiple courses and lectures both virtually and in person

such as the virtual event Quilt 2024, KC Maker Studio in Kansas City, MO, the St. Louis Modern Quilt Guild, and others. Most recently, he was a guest lecturer at the International Quilt Museum in Lincoln Nebraska.

YMCA T-Shirt Quilt

Using YMCA T-Shirts, a Geometric composition was created with a hidden "Y" logo in the middle section. The final quilt size was 52" x 75" and was quilted using <u>City Sewing</u> Room's walk-in long arm program

From traditional blocks and historical handwork to AI and super computers, Mac has explored multiple ways in which to engage communities in dialogue using quilts made from recycled textiles. This talk explores the quilt methods, materials, processes, and stories he has encountered in his quilt making journey over the last 10 years.

This year the theme is black and white and red all over! Well, not exactly. This year your challenge is to select black and white fabrics and pair them with a fabric the color of your choice.

Guidelines:

- ▼The fabrics can be solids or prints.
- ♥You chose the color of fabric you want to pair with black and white.
- ♥The quilt dimensions can range from 3" to 18". No quilt should be greater than 18" on a side
- ♥Quilts should measure in increments of 3". so 3", 6", 9",12",and 18" are acceptable dimensions.
- ♥Quilts must consist of three layers. Three dimensional quilts will be accepted.
- ♥Quilts that do not meet these guidelines will not be eligible for vote or awards. (But we can display and admire your work anyway!)

Due Date:

The November 2025 Guild meeting.

Awards:

The membership at the November 2025 meeting will vote for first, second and third place quilts. Prizes will be awarded to the people who made the top three quilts.





This workshop will take you beyond just cutting strips, squares, and rectangles with your Stripology rulers! Learn to utilize the ruler for 1/4" and 1/8" inch increment cutting, squaring up blocks, cutting 45 degree and 60-degree angles making basic quilt elements such as a Half-square Triangles and Flying Geese, and more!

The quilt is made with four different foundation paper-pieced half-rectangle triangles in three sizes. Students will receive instruction on foundation paper piecing and will be able to arrange their blocks to make many modern secondary designs.
