Suzanne Galli Koenen Sustainable Art

uzanne has a BFA in Studio Art from Maryville University with an emphasis on Painting and Printmaking. She has worked and lived her whole life with her art and has a working art studio and gallery in her home. She teaches classes and workshops.

Suzanne says, "It's all about the process. It's a need to focus and follow through until completion. I seek the time to discover my true potential, to repurpose, to recycle. I am a very creative person, but now I am also sustainable. I am a painter of color harmony."

Each project flows into another. Bits of fabric pieces that others discard become color tools until there is nothing left. There is no limit to

where these take her. It is a lifetime of sustainable art. She works with components: an add on process that is very improvisational. She draws her inspiration from life's memories.

She photographs many simple everyday objects that often have emotional ties. The photographs of finished pieces become fabric elements for future creations. She works in series. The "manikin" is a symbol of herself and her soul as she progresses through life, not inhibited by her physical being.

The scraps and strips of fibers are embraced into rugs and fabric bowls. The left over bits of scraps are then placed into glass jars of eye candy to be scattered and stitched making surface designs. Suzanne's paintings become the sources that are printed on fabric and stitched. She works on multiple pieces at a time. Sustainable. A circle with no limits.

This year the theme is black and white and red all over! Well, not exactly. This year your challenge is to select black and white fabrics and pair them with a fabric the color of your choice.

Guidelines:

- The fabrics can be solids or prints.
- You chose the color of fabric you want to pair with black and white.
- The quilt dimensions can range from 3" to 18". No quilt should be greater than 18" on a side.
- Quilts should measure in increments of 3". so 3", 6", 9",12",and 18" are acceptable dimensions.
- Quilts must consist of three layers. Three dimensional quilts will be accepted.
- Quilts that do not meet these guidelines will not be eligible for vote or awards. (But we can display and admire your work anyway!)

Due Date:

The **November 2025** Guild meeting.


Awards:

Texture Botanica Workshop May 12 and May 13



Art Bits is offering the **Texture Botanica workshop on May 12 and May 13** at Jackman's in Creve Coeur taught by Jane Baumstark and Rene Zar. The theme is creating leaves, branches, veins, stems and ground cover as textile art with mixed media and stitching techniques. 4 spots available as of May 1.

This two-day workshop is taught in two parts. Day 1 is all about the messy stuff: painting and adding color to fabrics, papers, fibers and uncommon materials. We continue on Day 2 with the painted fabrics and surfaces: we will wrap, weave, fold, distress, stitch, layer and emboss them using using to mediums, wax, heat, starch, inks and adhesives.

Dates: Monday, May 12 and Tuesday, May 13

Time: 10 am - 2 pm plus 1-hour bonus sessions on each day from 2:30 - 3:30 pm for

those who wish to stay.

Fee: \$55 for entire workshop

Fee includes use of paints, mediums, glues, gel plate, etc. and many fabrics, papers and materials.

This workshop will take you beyond just cutting strips, squares, and rectangles with your Stripology rulers! Learn to utilize the ruler for 1/4" and 1/8" inch increment cutting, squaring up blocks, cutting 45 degree and 60-degree angles making basic quilt elements such as a Half-square Triangles and Flying Geese, and more!
