Cheryl says, "Most of our inspiration Fassett Collective, with over 100,000 Members are so helpful, providing answers to questions we have about quilts, a pattern, or technique."

"Constant use has not worn ragged the fabric of their friendship." - Dorothy Parker

"This quote surely describes us!" says Reinagel. She made *Trip Around the World* at 18 with help from her grandmother. Her first "Kaffe" quilt was in 2012.

Little began quilting without a pattern making baby quilts. One was made from embroidery blocks she had stitched as a child. She also stitched around the printed designs in the fabrics she chose. Her first "Kaffe" quilt was in 2013, *Just Too Easy*.

Kaffe Fasset Collective fabrics, even though designed by three people, go well together because of their color choices.

These fabrics even blend with all the prior fabrics through the years.

Both quilters love the bright and bold surface design. "We enjoy having sew days together, and we love cooking together on those days, too. It's our hope that our quilt collections will become heirloom treasures someday,"

Together, they have traveled twice to the Houston International Quilt Festival, and every year they attend Annual American Quilter's Society (AQS) Quilt Show each spring in Paducah, Kentucky.

# Bits 'N' Pieces Celebrates Amy Kerkemeyer Cherrywood Challenge Finalist 2025 By Kathleen Strebeck, BnP Member

There were 4 known entrants from our Guild for the Cherrywood Challenge 2025, themed "The Abyss". Each year since 2014, Cherrywood Fabrics in Baxter, MN has sponsored an increasingly prestigious quilt competition entitled 'The Cherrywood Challenge'. Various themes over the last 10 years have been: Wicked, Lion King, Van Gogh, Prince, Bob Ross, Diana, Graffiti, Monarch, and Poppy. This year the theme is The Abyss which encouraged quilters to consider "creatures from the deep." The only fabric allowed on the front of the quilt are those included in the 8 fat-quarter bundle (\$56) supplied on order from Cherrywood when you decide you want to give it a shot. The quilts must be 20"x20" and should be inspired by the theme. Any technique is allowed, and any embellishments may be used. Lastly, they encourage the quilters to be creative and design a quilt that will be loved and will make the quilter happy.

Amy Kerkemeyer created a quilt entitled "The Tentacles Reach". It features a SCUBA diver which is being enveloped by the arm of a giant squid/octopus. Her interpretation was sparked by a scene from the TV series 'Rings of Power', which features an ominous deep-sea creature with twisting tentacles. That image haunted Amy and became the inspiration for her piece. She went through several revisions and finally shaped her concept into the quilt shown in the first photo below. It's an amazing piece that received the nod from the jury that her quilt is a Finalist and will tour the U.S. in 2025 and 2026 starting at the Houston International Quilt Market and Show in Houston in October! This is Amy's second submission to the Cherrywood Challenge; both times she has been successful in becoming a finalist. She notes that she loves the Cherrywood color palettes, which also simplifies that part of the design process as the colors are beautiful, preselected, hand-dyed fabrics. Congratulations, Amy!

Kay Strebeck, this author, did a quilt entitled "The Dragonfish: King of the Abyss" which is the second photo. For her inspiration, she channeled her imagination. She thought about going into the uncharted waters of the ocean and meeting a new creature that would scare anybody, all the time. The Dragonfish was born. She wrote a poem about the dreaded dragonfish which appears on the label on the back. The techniques used were applique and machine quilting. Her quilt did NOT get a 'thumbs up' from Cherrywood's jurists. However, she and the others can enter this quilt in many other shows; and it will certainly be placed in the next BnP show in March 2027! This Kay's third submission to the Cherrywood Challenge.

<u>Dinah Marchand also did a magnificent, original piece entitled "Yemaya"</u> of an African goddess named Yemaya that presents herself as a mermaid. Her colors are blue, white, and silver. She is the mother of fish. She protects women and children. The symbolism in her piece are the fish, shells (which are a gift to Yemaya), and the silver bead bars which represent the enslavement of the African people who were taken from Africa and sold as slaves in the United States. On their journey, the enslaved prayed to Yemaya for safety and security. The techniques she used were hand embroidery, beading (all the beads were put on one at a time), and domestic machine quilting.

Lastly, <u>Cindy Bell Neville</u>, <u>our BnP trained oceanographer</u>, <u>did a fantastic piece based in reality and science</u>. <u>Her quilt is entitled "Night Lights"</u>. She states that deep in the abyss where there is no light, and most critters are bioluminescent. You may have heard of the larger such denizens, but there are many, many very tiny creatures called plankton. Cindy chose to portray these tiny marvels in thread and beads. The featured creatures include: larvae of a crab, lobster, and snail, a juvenile jewel squid, a Cyclops and a jellyfish. Her techniques included improvisational curved piecing, contour quilting, and beading.

These four quilters would likely agree that doing a Cherrywood Challenge quilt requires enthusiasm for the theme, creativity, lots of time, and a love of art quilting. The Cherrywood Challenge theme for 2026 has been announced; it is "Storytime." The narrative encourages the quilter to think of your favorite classic book that you just had to read over and over again as a child. The old storybooks had a unique illustrative style, paper, colors, feel and smell. The due date has been moved up to 15 February 2026; in the past the cutoff date was 15 May. The other rules remain the same. There are eight colors in the curated bundle of fabrics (rust, mango, goldenrod, caramel, sepia, misty aqua, and jade), and there is an optional sketchbook bundle of 4 more colors (charcoal, mahogany, taupe, and buttercream). # Bits n Pieces Quilt Guild 2025 Challenge Harriett Zipfel - 2r2tnoe@gmail.com

This year the theme is black and white and red all over! Well, not exactly. This year your challenge is to select black and white fabrics and pair them with a fabric the color of your choice.

#### **Guidelines:**

- The fabrics can be solids or prints.
- You chose the color of fabric you want to pair with black and white.
- The quilt dimensions can range from 3" to 18". No quilt should be greater than 18" on a side.
- Quilts should measure in increments of 3". so 3", 6", 9",12",and 18" are acceptable dimensions.
- Quilts must consist of three layers. Three dimensional quilts will be accepted.
- Quilts that do not meet these guidelines will not be eligible for vote or awards. (But we can display and admire your work anyway!)

Reminder that the challenge is due at the November meeting. Any size that is a multiple of 3. So 3, 6,9,12,18 inches. 18" is the maximum length and 3" is the minimum length of any side. Black and white plus one color. Embellishments may be any color.
